Theology

All students must also have a textbook, which can be borrowed from the instructor (details below).

Recommended for students ages 13 to 17 (8th to 11th grade) who have had no previous Spanish instruction, but self-motivated 12-year-olds (7th graders) are also welcome.

About two hours of homework will be assigned per week, and there will be short, individual presentations to prepare at least three times throughout the year. Students will be expected to purchase a notebook for their personal use along with a Descubre activity workbook (which will be ordered by the teacher), and index cards are recommended for making flash cards. All students must also have a textbook, which can be borrowed from the instructor (details below).

This class is recommended for students ages 14 to 18 (9th to 12th) who have completed a Spanish I course. Self-motivated 13-year-olds (8th graders) who have taken Spanish I are also welcome. Students should already know the present tense conjugations of verbs and basic grammar and vocabulary.

SS: The Story of Governments in Western Civilization and their Impact on America, High School

Current trends in American education have emphasized the personalized meaning of the social sciences at the expense of establishing a common intellectual context for understanding the growth and dynamics of the American Democratic Republic. I propose to lead students through the story of Western governments leading up to the creation of the American Constitution and then note significant events for our Republic over the last 200 years.

Life Skills

LS SEW: Beginning Sewing, Ages 8-14

In this class students will be learning a range of sewing techniques, beginning with simple hand sewing projects which will prepare them for working on the sewing machine. These beginner projects will include learning several stitch types, sewing on buttons, exploring and working with different fabrics, and cutting/pinning. Students will be learning how to hem dress pants/skirts and jeans, as well as finishing seams, then eventually creating and constructing garments of their own. They can expect to complete between 4-6 projects throughout the year, depending on how quickly we move along.
