EARLY ELEMENTARY CLASSES

Kindergarten

Time: All Year, 9:00 - 12:00

Class Fee: \$20

Class Description: The teachers reinforce what is being taught at home at the kindergarten level. Each week students will learn about a new theme. Reading, math, social studies, science, and language concepts are taught throughout the year. Your kindergartener will have a great time and won't even realize he is learning.

1st GRADE

Time: All Year, 9:00 - 12:00

Class Fee: \$20

Required Text: First Language Lessons Level 1 OR First Language Lessons Level 1 & 2

Class Description: Students complete the first level of First Language Lessons, first grade science, and first grade history. The science and history curricula will be completed in class with no work required at home. Students will complete one lesson of First Language Lessons at co-op, leaving 2-3 lessons per week to be completed at home. They will learn poetry, basic grammar terms, and oral narration. Math games, crafts, and music will complete our curriculum for the morning.

Expectations/Notes

 Parents are encouraged to review lessons and topics covered during class, but are also free to choose curriculum and address math and reading instruction as appropriate for the child in their family.

Grading: Students will not receive grades at this level.

2nd GRADE

Time: All Year, 9:00 – 12:00

Class Fee: \$20

Required Text:

- First Language Lessons Level 2 OR First Language Lessons Level 1 & 2
- IEW Primary Arts of Language, Writing (Provided by FAITH)

Class Description: Students will complete the second level of First Language Lessons, second grade science, and second grade history. The science and history curricula will be completed in class with no work required at home. Students will learn poetry, basic grammar terms, and oral narration while completing First Language Lessons at home. In an effort to prepare students for 3rd grade, they will learn how to structure sentences correctly in the fall semester. They will also learn beginning writing skills using the IEW PALS program in the spring.

Grading: Students will not receive grades at this level.

Class Description:

SCIENCE CLASSES

APOLOGIA BOTANY & ASTRONOMY

Time: All Year, 12:30-3:00 Grade Level: K-2nd Grades

Class Fee: \$15

Textbook/Supplies Required: NOTE: These textbooks are OPTIONAL. Students will complete the "Try This" activities during afternoon rotations, and teachers will cover the material in the text. If parents choose to follow along with their students at home, they are welcome to purchase the texts, but it is not required.

Class Description: Students will use Apologia's *Exploring Creation with Botany* and *Exploring Creation with Astronomy* (one semester each) to study our solar system and plants. With multiple hands-on activities in 14 lessons each semester, students will explore and learn about the sun, planets, asteroid belt, dwarf planets, the Kuiper belt galaxies, nebulae, and even black holes as they reveal the marvel and might of our loving Creator. Through the fall semester, students will build a model solar system, make a solar eclipse, compass, and telescope, watch a meteor shower, launch a rocket, make clouds, and locate constellations. During the spring semester, students will explore the life cycle of seeds to plants, how plants reproduce and make their food, and how to identify and classify a variety of plants.

- This class is designed for fun, hands-on learning.

APOLOGIA SWIMMING CREATURES

Time: All Year, 12:30-1:45 Grade Level: 3rd/4th Grades

Class Fee: \$15

Textbook/Supplies Required:

Class Description:

Time: All Year, 12:30-1:45 Grade Level: 5th/6th Grades
