



Frequently Asked Questions:

Q. Do I have to be a member to attend monthly parents meetings?

A. No, the parents meetings are open to anyone. However, you must be a member to participate in most of the other activities.

Q. Do you have childcare at your meetings?

A. Childcare is provided at our monthly parents meetings when you have reserved a place in advance. There is a requested donation of \$2 per child. You must r.s.v.p. at least five days prior to the event by contacting Jamey at jmclintock@paonline.com or 717-432-3774

As a mother of seven, our president is very aware of the desire some of you may feel to keep your children close to you. We recognize that even though we provide childcare, some parents may not wish to leave their children. Because of that, we have established a policy that well-behaved, quiet children and nursing babies may attend the meetings along with their parents. However, at no time are children to be unsupervised. We ask that you are considerate of other parents who are attending the meeting in hopes of a peaceful "mom's or dad's night out."

Q. If I am a member, am I required to attend the meetings?

A. No. Although we work hard to plan topics that are relevant and helpful to a broad audience and we believe the monthly parents meetings may be beneficial to you in many ways, you are not "required" to attend. Our goal and purpose as a homeschool association is to support and encourage you, not place another burden on you.

Q. Where are your monthly meetings held?

A. Although our special events are held at various locations, our monthly parents meetings are traditionally held at the same place. Christian Life Assembly is the location for these parents meetings. The address of the church is 2645 Lisburn Road, Camp Hill, PA 17011. Once you are at the church, look for signs that will direct you. Occasionally there are variances, but the majority of the time we meet on the west side of the church.
