Study Hall

Study hall is available for grades 4-12 during all three hours of Co-op, and is supervised by a parent assigned to that area. The official purpose is to provide a quiet area where students who need to complete regular schoolwork can study.

Occasionally Study Hall is provided for a class whose teacher is absent, in the event that there is no substitute available. Study Hall is also sometimes used as a disciplinary measure for students who come unprepared for their regular class. It is very rarely used for students who have been consistently disruptive in their class, though the preferred course of action in that case is to contact the parent and have them take charge of their own child.

Personal listening devices are permitted during Study Hall, if they help a student focus, but electronic games and other distracting things are not. Computer usage must have a specific school purpose, not for games. The supervising parent in Study Hall has authority to request students put away, or to confiscate offensive devices, to be returned at the end of the Co-op day. Food is not permitted during Study Hall.

Winsome Communication of Truth: Apologetics

Course Description:

Winsome Apologetics aspires to teach how to Biblically reason in a winsome and non-emotionally charged manner to the many ideas that raise themselves against the knowledge of God (2 Cor 10:3-5). The confusion of our culture on existential questions is expected; unfortunately, this confusion extends into the church due to a lack of Biblical understanding and fear of discussion. Philippians 3:15 says that even the things we disagree on (in the body of Christ), God will make clear or bring unity. The book of Proverbs also describes man sharpening one another as iron sharpens iron. We need to be a people that first and always seek truth in love; we also need to own that understanding, articulating in a winsome way to those who may think differently. If there is disagreement, GOOD! This should be an opportunity to grow--either firming up our understanding as Apollos did while speaking with Aquila and Priscilla, or sharpening others in their understanding. Believers need to both learn their Scriptures (contextually & holistically) and be able to incite desire in conversations through good questions, respectful dialog, and Biblical reasoning.

The class focus may cover questions broached by Apologetics from NCFCA style limited prep speech, and the education will certainly inform better argumentation and delivery in a contest; however, my focus is not on training NCFCA students, but on training children of God to communicate truth in love.

Expectations and Goals

The development of reasoning skills and argumentation will be the focus of class time. Students will be expected to research various topics of interest, practice reasoning skills, and prepare for presentations (not PowerPoints per se, but arguments and logical flows of reason). The key text is the Bible--general reading for breadth of understanding is expected to be ongoing; specific text to be read in greater depth will be assigned along with research topics. Occasionally, additional articles may be assigned. **(Continued on next page)**

The true requirement is simply a passion for learning and willingness to challenge ones own analytical skills. Students should have read through the entire Bible at least once (summer is plenty of time to accomplish this, if it is not in your previous experience prior to registration.)

8th grade students with high school level analysis and reasoning skills can be allowed with teacher permission.

Homework: Homework effort is expected to average 1hr/wk with higher loading around presentation preparation. This time estimate does not include daily Bible reading; so, if the student is not already engaged in daily, full-Bible reading that would cover the entire text in a year or there about, then please add an additional 30minutes/day to this time estimate.

Course Description:

You've learned the ins and outs of how the body works. . .now use that knowledge to solve mysteries! This highly interactive, case-based class will take the concepts learned in Bones, Blood, and Breath Sounds to the next level. Students will learn about medical history taking and diagnostics (radiology, phlebotomy, etc), and every week they'll use their knowledge and critical thinking skills to figure out the disease causing an imaginary patient's symptoms. **Prerequisites:** Must have taken Bones, Blood, and Breath Sounds in the past, or demonstrate commensurate knowledge of human anatomy and physiology **Homework:** Minimal, except for an end-of-the-year project. During the last month or two of the year, students will research medical conditions on their own and present cases to the group.

Debaters will learn research skills, respectful argumentation, refutation, organization, and effective presentation and speaking skills. Debaters will have the benefit of the experience of Eva who has competed in NCFCA Christian Speech & Debate for five years and has qualified to the National Championship twice.

After reviewing the basics of debate and public speaking, the class will consist of practice rounds, drills, and other exercises. Debate rounds will be critiqued by the instructors and other students. More experienced debaters will explore and practice more advanced debate theory. This course is open to beginners and experienced debaters.

Course Description:

The *Financial Wealth Building: Foundations for a Lifetime* class is a multi-faceted class covering history of money, taxes, investment strategies, tax sheltering, options trading, and if time permits, cryptocurrencies and cryptotechnologies.

The MATLAB coding environment will be used extensively in this course. MATLAB will be used to conduct trade studies between investment and tax sheltering strategies. We will utilize the MATLAB environment to conduct visual data analysis that augments the students' understanding of core financial principles.

*MATLAB is used quite extensively in the fields of engineering and economics/finance. If the students are interested in pursuing careers in either of these fields the topics covered and supporting MATLAB exercises will provide a significant advantage over their peers.

Prerequisites: MATLAB coding will be taught alongside the topics mentioned above, however it is recommended that the student is familiar with basic coding structures: function calls, variables, if else statements, for loops and while loops. (note: prior to the start of the semester, students will be provided lessons plan to understand basic concepts)

Core mathematical competencies: Algebra

Homework: Approximately 3 hours per week. This is intended to be an intellectually demanding course and will require full student commitment to assigned reading and homework.
