Class Descriptions and Texts Needed

8:30-10:00

Pre-Chemistry/Pre-Physics (Grades 8-10) Class can be taken before or after Biology. Student will cover a chapter in 1-2 weeks. Experiments will be done in class. **Text: Bob Jones -The Physical World. An Introduction to Physical Science. ISBN 1-59166-641-4 (1st Edition).**

World History (Grades 9-12) We will approach our study of world history from a providential point of view. Because we seek to see the bigger story of God's plan unfolding through time, we will dedicate much of our time in the first semester to a look at Old and New Testament history. Additionally, we will focus on the key ideas, worldview presuppositions and their development of life and thought throughout the history of mankind. We will look at some of the key individuals, groups and events of history that influenced and shaped it. The scope of our study will take us from creation to the present, and will encompass both Eastern and Western societies; so this class truly is a survey of world. **Text: The Promise and the Blessing by Michael Harbin BJU Press World History Student Text (3rd edition)** Supplies: 3 Ring Binder, Paper, Sharpened Pencils, Colored Pencils.

10:00-11:30

Spanish 2 (Grades 10-12) **Prerequisite: Spanish 1.** Continuation of grammar and conversation skills. **Text: A BEKA Spanish 2. Books 2A & 2B, plus Vocabulary Manual, CD's recommended.**

Language Arts (Grades 7-10) We will study English grammar and mechanics. Moreover, we will read a variety of literary pieces and poetry which will be the basis of the students' spelling and vocabulary lessons. We will do book reviews and write short compositions. **Text: 180 Daily Teaching Lessons Grade 9 Student Workbook by Wanda C. Philips, 2010.**

11:30-1:00

Spanish 1 (Grades 8-12) Presentation of grammar and conversation skills. **Text: A BEKA Spanish 1 - Books 1A & 1B, plus Vocabulary Manual, CD's recommended. \$10 copy fee-due the first day of class.**

Chemistry (Grades 10-12) Topics include thermodynamics, kinetics, acids and bases, and atomic structure. Experiments will be done in class. **Text: Apologia Exploring Creation with Chemistry 2nd edition.**

Consumer Math (Grades 9-12) **Warning, Mine Field directly ahead!** Great losses may occur without proper preparation. Decisions made in the next few years will affect your student's financial well-being for decades. Now is the time to learn the basics of tithing, budgeting, taxes, insurance, savings and investments, credit, and long-term financial goals. This course will provide opportunities for your family to interact so your values can be handed down in an orderly manner. **Internet access required. Text: Financial Literacy from a Christian Perspective by 7 Sisters. (\$23.33 group rate).** The class may be adapted for Advanced or Honors Levels for an additional fee. This could be the most useful class your high schooler will ever take.

1:00-2:30

Biology - (Grades 9-12) Student will cover a module every two weeks. Lab Experiments will be done in class. **Text: Apologia Exploring Creation with Biology 2nd edition.**

Sign Language (Intro to Deaf Community and ASL) – 1st Semester (Ages 13 and up) Are you wanting to learn American Sign Language and about Deaf culture and history? Then this is the class for you! Through this interactive class, you will gain an understanding of how ASL formed in the United States and how it has developed and changed over time. You will be able to start conversing with people who know sign when speaking aloud isn't an option. You will learn about Deaf culture and the norms of the community. This is a great introductory course to teach you more about sign language and deafness. Supplies needed: paper, writing utensils.

Exploratory Classes: 1:00 – 2:30

Pottery - (Ages 13 and above) Students will experience, age and interest, hands-on techniques in hand building and on the wheel. Processes will involve sequential skill building. Students will be encouraged to explore, develop and combine their ideas. **Supply cost: \$15 includes cost of clay, firing and glazes.**

Painting - (Ages 13-18) Preferred medium: Acrylic or Gouache. Explore and develop individual skill sets. Still life will be introduced to enhance sequential skill development (techniques). We will begin with seeing versus looking through drawing before adding color. Students may bring own resources following first class. Art appreciation will be a natural outcome of the curriculum. Goal of the course is to support personal creativity and acceptance of art within a framework of elements and principles. **Supply Fee: \$15 Includes all necessary materials.**
