Class Descriptions

Writing

4th - 8th Student Writing Intensive Level B Introduction: Using an incremental approach, this program teaches not just **what** to write, but **how** to write by providing the student with practical writing tools, Recorded live with Mr. Andrew Pudewa, this four-DVD writing course for middle school students new to IEW lays a solid foundation of writing skills. Students will learn how to effectively use a wide range of structural models and stylistic techniques in their compositions, as they write on a variety of enjoyable fiction and non-fiction topics. Between co-op meetings, students will have writing assignments to be completed at home.

5th - 8th Student Writing Intensive Level B Introduction Continuation Year 1:

This course picks up where the Student Writing Intensive Level B left off and advances writing strength. Providing one year of instruction, it presents new models and techniques while allowing for ample practice and reinforcement. Level B Intro completed for participation in Year 1

6th - 9th Student Writing Intensive Level B Introduction Continuation Year 2:

Students who have completed the Student Writing Intensive Level B and Continuation Year 1 can continue another year as this course continues to presents even more new models and techniques, while also teaching essay and research paper writing. Year 1 completed for participation in Year 2

Expectations:

Co-Op Day" is a cooperative effort on the part of C.A.C.H.E. homeschooling families who desire to work with other homeschooling families in the Body of Christ to enrich our children's education. Classes will be coordinated, supervised and led by homeschool parents. Programs will operate on a co-op basis, so every adult is expected to be an active participant on one team— sharing input, ideas, planning and presenting material, and assisting however needed. Whenever families will be absent, they are expected to contact their Team Coordinator as far in advance as possible, to make arrangements to cover their responsibilities. When children are present, a parent from that family must also be present in the building (unless prior arrangements have been made with Support Team.)

Science Co-Ops

K-3rd Apologia Exploring Creation with Chemistry & Physics: The activities and projects in this course are sure to delight and inspire your young minds. Students will make their own bouncy ball, formulate a smoke bomb, build a solar oven, construct a working periscope, fashion a miniature motor, and create a lava lamp! All the while, God will be glorified as the Master Designer of all that they're discovering about the world and how it works. We recommend purchasing one textbook per family to participate in this class.

3rd-7th Apologia Exploring Creation with Chemistry & Physics: The activities and projects in this course are sure to delight and inspire your young minds. They'll begin by exploring the basic building blocks of creation, atoms and molecules, and then journey through simple chemicals, the laws of motion, and energy in its many forms, before discovering concepts of electricity and magnetism. Along the way, your students will make their own bouncy ball, formulate a smoke bomb, build a solar oven, construct a working periscope, fashion a miniature motor, and create a lava lamp! All the while, God will be glorified as the Master Designer of all that they're discovering about the world and how it works. We recommend purchasing one textbook per family to participate in this class.

K-6th Art Class: Using the book *Art Labs for Kids* by Susan Schwake this fun and creative class will explore many different art mediums, including: charcoal, oil pastels, watercolor, acrylic, paper collage and much more. Each class also features the work of a prominent artist for inspiration. This is a great class for creating fine art with children of all skill levels! There may be a supply list of items needed to bring to class as well as an **extra \$20 fee per student (due 1st day of class)** for CACHE to purchase some supplies in bulk.
