## WEC Doctrinal Statement

Wishing to fulfill the scripture: "Make my joy complete by being of the same mind, having the same love, and being in full accord and of one mind," (Phil. 2:2) we of W.E.C. have purposed that our organization be consistently and forthrightly Christian.

Implications of this are that we are unable to allow non-Christian activities, presentations, witnessing, literature, or communications into our group. Our intent is not to be divisive or exclusive. We simply feel it is essential that everyone be "of the same mind" if our group is to function harmoniously. Therefore, it is vital that all be aware of the foundation on which this group is built if they are to wholeheartedly be a part of it.

All participants must be able to abide by, and all Executive Committee members must be in full agreement with the following doctrinal statement.

- 1. The Bible is the inspired and infallible Word of God and constitutes completed and final revelation. The Bible, its original autograph, is without error in whole and in part, including theological concepts as well as geographical and historical details.
- 2. God has existed from all eternity in three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Jesus Christ is God come in human flesh being fully God and fully man except without sin.
- 3. All men are in violation of God's righteous requirements and His holy character both by nature and act, and are therefore under His wrath and just condemnation. The central purpose of the coming of Jesus Christ was to pay the penalty of man's sin through His substitutionary death on the cross the successful accomplishment of which was attested to by His subsequent visible, bodily resurrection.
- 4. Salvation is offered as a gift free to the sinner. This gift must be responded to in individual faith, not trusting in any personal works whatsoever, but in the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ alone.
