* FYI: State law requires public school students to also earn 1 full Health & PE credit and 5 elective credits for a total of 21 credits to graduate.

Credits

- According to Title 22 § 57.31, which defines credits for the public school, 1 credit is 120-clock hours.
- According to PA-approved diploma programs like Mason Dixon, 1 credit may be measured by
 - Logged entries (need 120 for 1 credit, 60 for ½ credit)
 - Completion of 2/3 of a textbook designed for a full-credit course (1/3 for a ½ credit)
 - OR 1 substantial 10-page paper
- Dual enrollment college courses of 3 or 4 credits is typically equal to 1 high school credit.
- Homeschool graduation requirements are defined by 23 P.S. § 13-1327(d). It doesn't give the graduation requirements in terms of credits but rather in terms of years:
 - Four years of English (to include language, literature, speech, and composition over the course of those years)
 - Three years of mathematics.
 - Three years of science.
 - Three years of social studies.
 - Two years of arts and humanities

- Creative Option
 - Credits do not have to be met through traditional school-based learning. They could be:
 - Experience/Internship
 - Projects/ Self-Study
 - Creative combination of co-op classes
 - With an evaluator's help, non-traditional learning can be labeled (truthfully) with traditional course titles for the transcript if confusing college admissions is a concern.
