

Grace Homeschool Co-op FAQs

Q: When is registration for the '26-'27 academic year?

A: Registration was held in April for the '26-'27 academic year, but we will hold a late registration June 8th - please email ghc.questions@gmail.com for those details.

Q: Will you be open to members from outside the current community?

A: We do have limited availability for our late registration for new families. We have been able to add families in the last few years - however, please note, it may not always be the "perfect schedule" your first year with us.

Q: How much are classes and what other fees are involved?

A: Classes have a range of prices depending on grade and how often they meet. Here are some examples of what the cost of classes are: PK4-4th grade classes - \$140-\$180/class. Middle School elective/non-core classes that meet once a week are roughly \$160-\$190/class. Middle School core classes (history, literature, math, science) that meet twice a week range from \$295-\$375/class. High School core classes that meet twice a week range from \$350-\$460/class while elective/non-core classes that meet once a week are \$170-\$200/class. These numbers do not include any textbooks/curriculum you will also need to purchase. There is a Family Registration Fee, Background Check & Website Fee per family - those prices can be found in our Family Handbook.

Q: When do you meet for classes?

A: Our co-op meets on Monday & Wednesday from 10:30am - 4pm. PK4-4th grade only meets on Mondays, with the exception of our limited 1st-4th club classes that meet Wednesdays. Our upper level classes that meet twice a week have mirrored class schedules on M&W while we do have some stand-alone classes for 5th grade and above on both M&W.

Q: Are you a "drop & go" co-op?

A: In a way, yes. However, in order to function in this way and run as a cooperative, parents must serve each semester by fulfilling service duty hours (3 hour time-slots either at the sign-in table, hallway monitor, parking lot, cafe, etc). The amount of shifts you must serve depends on how many members we have each year, but you can usually plan for about 8-10 shifts a year PER day (Mon and/or Wed) you attend co-op. More details about service duty can be found in our Family Handbook.

Q: Do you have a study hall?

A: Our cafe serves as a study hall and fellowship space for students who are at least 10 years of age or older (to be in there without a parent). If under 10, parents are welcome to sit in there with their child.

Q: Do you need tutors or classroom assistants (CA)?

A: We have filled all tutor positions for the '26-'27 academic year and have very limited CA positions left. These spots are generally filled with current members.
