Further Up, Further In: Narnia

Full Year, Grades 6-8
 Maximum Students: 15
 Class Fee: \$0

Class Description: This class is based on C.S. Lewis' The Chronicles of Narnia book series. It will cover a wide range of subjects including English, history, social studies, science, and Bible. Be ready to read! We will be going through all seven books in the series, one per month. In addition to the reading, there will be a short weekly writing assignment and vocab work.

Homework: Weekly reading, vocab, and writing assignments.

Required Curriculum: All seven books of The Chronicles of Narnia. A set is available on Amazon for \$35.

Other Materials Required: Students will need a 3-ring binder with 8 dividers, paper, pencils, and colored pencils.

Musical Theater

Full Year, Grades 6-12
 Maximum Students: 20
 Class Fee: \$40
 Credits Earned: 1 Arts Credit; Pass or Fail

Class Description: Come sing and dance with friends! This class will explore the history of musical theater, and teach students how to sing and dance with a group. Students will be taught choreography to songs and learn to perform as a group. Students will watch some performances and take notes to help students understand how to bring singing and dancing together. The fall semester will focus on the history of musical theater, watching different musical selections (family friendly!), doing small selections of songs to sing and dance to, and learning about the audition process to be in a musical. The spring semester will begin with students coming to audition for the different songs we will learn to perform at the end of the year family showcase. We will then spend the semester learning the songs, learning parts, and choreography to bring these songs to life and having rehearsals during class time. Students should be comfortable with singing and being on stage. Prior dancing is not required at all but students will be required to learn dance steps for the songs and have to be moving. Song selections will be made towards the end of the fall semester.

Homework: Memorize song lyrics and practice choreography outside of class by the set dates. This class does require students to perform during the end of the year showcase in April.

Required Curriculum: No curriculum needed. Students do need to be able to sing. Prior dance experience is not required at all but students do need to be willing to learn choreography and retain the moves taught. Class fees will be used to purchase song copyrights in order for us to perform. Class fees will also be used for making copies of song lyrics, printing photos for the family showcase and any other props needed.

Other Materials Required: Highlighters, notebook paper, pencils. Students need to wear proper shoes (tennis shoes or even being barefoot) will help to ensure students are safe while dancing. Students also need to wear clothing that allows them to be modest and comfortable since they will be stretching and dancing. Students will need to provide some things on their own for the showcase. This will include a black shirt and black leggings (for girls) and casual black slacks (for guys). First Period

Exploring Creation with Biology

Full Year Grade 9-12

Maximum Students: 20

Class Fee: \$25

Credits Earned: 1 Credit, final grade given by the parent

Class Description: This course gives students an overview of methods and concepts of general biology. Topics covered are the vocabulary of biology, the background of the scientific method, the five-kingdom classification scheme, microscopy, biochemistry, ecosystems, cellular biology, genetics, creation science, evolution, and dissection. Co-op time will focus on weekly labs.

Homework: Students will be expected to read assigned pages, complete homework assignments, take tests, and complete lab reports (from labs done at co-op) before class. Completed lab reports will be turned in to class the following week to be graded. However, test grades and the final class grade will be given by the parent. During co-op, the class will complete the lab portion of the class and review and discuss concepts from the text.

Money Mindset - A Journey to Financial Independence

Full Year, Grades 9-12

Maximum Students: 25

Class Fee: \$70 (includes curriculum)

Credits Earned: Personal Finance/Math (1.0 credit)

Class Description: Money shapes nearly every aspect of life—where you live, the opportunities you pursue, how you support yourself or a family, and the future you build.

Students will learn how to understand their income, build and manage a realistic budget, and compare career paths based on salary and lifestyle. They will explore housing options using real platforms, plan for future expenses such as family life, and develop a strong understanding of credit, loans, and debt. Most importantly, students will learn how to set meaningful financial goals and make decisions that support long-term stability.

This course is highly interactive and practical. Rather than simply reading about financial concepts, students actively apply them through real-world projects. They will choose a career and calculate their expected income, create a monthly budget, explore housing options, and evaluate lifestyle choices. Activities such as managing a “Flour Baby” help students understand responsibility, time management, and the real-life impact of financial decisions. Students will also learn to assess assets, liabilities, and overall net worth.

In addition to practical skills, this course encourages future-focused thinking. Students will reflect on the kind of life they want to build, identify what matters most to them, and learn how to align their financial choices with their personal values, career goals, and desired lifestyle.

Homework: There will be daily homework required for this class. This may take 30 minutes or more daily. Please do not sign up for this class unless you are committed to keeping up with the daily work assigned.

Required Curriculum: Students will need the Money Mindset - A Journey to Financial Independence Workbook, developed specifically for this course by the instructor. This workbook includes all lessons, guided activities, and project materials required for successful completion of the course. The fee for this book is included in the class fee.

High School Phys-Ed

Full Year, Grades 9-12

Maximum Students:

Class Fee: \$10

Credits Earned: 1

Class Description: This high school Physical Education (PE) course is designed to promote lifelong fitness, health awareness, and personal wellness through a variety of physical activities and educational experiences. Students engage in regular exercise routines that may include cardiovascular training, strength conditioning, flexibility exercises, and recreational sports. The course encourages goal setting, self-discipline, and personal accountability by allowing students to track their progress and reflect on their fitness journey. In addition to physical activity, students learn the fundamentals of health-related fitness, including nutrition, injury prevention, and the benefits of an active lifestyle. Emphasis is placed on developing habits that support both physical and mental well-being.

Other Materials Required: Students are encouraged to bring a water bottle and a gym bag with a change of clothes and deodorant.

Second Period

Musical Theater

Full Year, Grades 6-12

Maximum Students: 20

Class Fee: \$40

Credits Earned: 1 Arts Credit; Pass or Fail

Class Description: Come sing and dance with friends! This class will explore the history of musical theater, and teach students how to sing and dance with a group. Students will be taught choreography to songs and learn to perform as a group. Students will watch some performances and take notes to help students understand how to bring singing and dancing together. The fall semester will focus on the history of musical theater, watching different musical selections (family friendly!), doing small selections of songs to sing and dance to, and learning about the audition process to be in a musical. The spring semester will begin with students coming to audition for the different songs we will learn to perform at the end of the year family showcase. We will then spend the semester learning the songs, learning parts, and choreography to bring these songs to life and having rehearsals during class time. Students should be comfortable with singing and being on stage. Prior dancing is not required at all but students will be required to learn dance steps for the songs and have to be moving.

Song selections will be made towards the end of the fall semester.

Homework: Memorize song lyrics and practice choreography outside of class by the set dates. This class does require students to perform during the end of the year showcase in April.

Required Curriculum: No curriculum needed. Students do need to be able to sing. Prior dance experience is not required at all but students do need to be willing to learn choreography and retain the moves taught. Class fees will be used to purchase song copyrights in order for us to perform. Class fees will also be used for making copies of song lyrics, printing photos for the family showcase and any other props needed.

Other Materials Required: Highlighters, notebook paper, pencils. Students need to wear proper shoes (tennis shoes or even being barefoot) will help to ensure students are safe while dancing. Students also need to wear clothing that allows them to be modest and comfortable since they will be stretching and dancing. Students will need to provide some things on their own for the showcase. This will include a black shirt and black leggings (for girls) and casual black slacks (for guys). Depending on the song selections chosen, clothing/materials from home can possibly be used for costume pieces or props.

Biblical Womanhood

Full Year, Grades 7-12

Maximum Students: 12

Class Fee: \$10

Credits Earned: 1 elective (humanities)

Class Description:

We will dive into the Bible and read about real women such as Eve, Esther, Ruth, Hagar, Mary and others. We will discuss the attributes these women had and how they were used by God. We will see that these attributes are timeless and we can walk in them today to serve the Lord. My heart is that we can study and see that each girl is fearfully and wonderfully made. I want each girl to feel encouraged in the strong, confident, feminine way that God has made them. And how to live that out in their life, friendships and future home.

Students will engage in critical thinking, discussions, and creative writing to deepen their appreciation of literature.

Homework: Lots of Reading! Yay! There also will be some writing!

Required Curriculum: I have not picked all the books we will enjoy yet! But, we will start with The Outsiders. As soon as I pick a study guide I will send an email.

Third Period

Government and Economics

Full Year, Grades 9-12

Maximum Students: 10

Class Fee: \$0

Credits Earned: 1 Social Studies Credit (0.5 Government and 0.5 Economics)

Class Description: This is a 2-part class, broken down by semester:

1st Semester: Exploring Government covers the government of the US from its beginning to the present with specific emphasis on the Biblical pattern for government and the US Constitution. Students will learn about federal, state, and local government and become better equipped to understand our country's government as they learn about contemporary issues facing our nation today.

2nd Semester: Exploring Economics gives teens the education to understand what's going on in the world around them by emphasizing faith in God and trusting His Word. Students will learn how being knowledgeable about economics will help them to be an informed contributor to the economy on many levels. Students will also study the importance of the free market system as they learn clear explanations of key terms and concepts.

Homework: daily reading and weekly questions; occasional projects; course work may be assigned before the start of co-op classes

Required Curriculum: Please do not purchase until you hear for sure- the teacher is deciding between a few curriculums. She will most likely use Notgrass or Masterbooks.

Exploring World Geography

Full Year, Grades 9-12

Maximum Students: 15

Class Fee: \$0

Credits Earned: 1 Social Studies (1 optional English credit if done at home)

Class Description: From the publisher: Exploring World Geography by Ray Notgrass is a one-year high school course that describes and explains the world God created. Students will learn about mankind's interaction with the world both in the past and in the present. The curriculum addresses two main questions: How has the physical world made a difference in what people have done, how they have lived, and how they live today? How have people made a difference in the physical world, and how are they making a difference in it today?

Homework: daily reading and questions; occasional projects

Credits Earned: 1 Elective Credit

Class Description: False types of arguments are everywhere. In this introduction to the art of argument, learn how to discern which arguments are valid and which are not, and how to “argue” well with reason, clarity, relevance, and purpose. We will study 28 logical fallacies with the purpose of providing a lasting framework for filtering good and bad reasoning, while learning how to write and speak effectively. *Please note: While we may use examples of, and study different debates, this is NOT a debate class where we will be actively debating against each other.*

Homework: There will be weekly homework for this class.

Art

Full Year, Grades 9-12

Maximum Students: 10

Class Fee: \$10

Credits Earned: 1 High School Credit.

Class Description: Students will benefit from a complete overview of the artistic process from concept to creation. *Artistic Pursuits* is a full-fledged art program that teaches art history, the elements of art and composition, and media and technique while encouraging students towards creative expression. We will focus on the elements of art, including space, line, value, proportion, and texture by giving students projects centered on drawings and paintings that use graded pencils, charcoal, and different types of brushes .

Homework: Explaining topics and making connections to real world experiences, students will apply their new observations and learn about artists and the time they lived in, techniques and how to use the materials and tools of art, projects include drawing life objects, landscapes, portraits, and more.
