CHOICE 2- DIY Cooking- Don't Buy That....Make it! - Renee Doerfler

Many of the foods we often think we need to pay for are actually very easy to make at home. This semester, we will be making AND EATING a variety of food items from scratch such as smoothies and Frappuccinos, crackers, condiments, Alfredo sauce, brownies, applesauce, and more! We will discuss the cost savings and health benefits of making your own versions of these items at home versus buying them at the store. We will also discuss reasons why at times we might still choose to purchase these items at the store, even after we know how to make our own. This class will be fun, delicious, enlightening, and empowering!

CHOICE 3- Beginner Crocheting – Shallon Rohrer

Students will learn how to make a slip knot and a chain of stitches. We will then continue on to learn how to do a single crochet stitch by making a small swatch. We will go over crochet abbreviations and students will learn how to read a crochet pattern. Students will use a crochet pattern to make a dishcloth by the end of the semester. Some crochet work at home will be necessary.

Presentation Skills- Sue Whitney

A fun and challenging class that ends up giving confidence in an area where there is usually much fear: public speaking. Beginning with a super simple recitation and ending in a presentation with props, the students will acquire all the skills needed to effectively deliver all kinds of oratories. Using a fun and light hearted approach, the students will also learn how to give and receive constructive criticism. No research will be required, as all the speech materials will be supplied. In addition, materials needed for the props will also be supplied. This often ends up being a student favorite.
