

Education Issues

The Samana region of the Dominican Republic faces significant educational challenges due to poverty, lack of resources, and poorly trained teachers. The quality of education in the region is a significant concern. According to data from the Dominican Republic's Ministry of Education, in 2019, only 26% of students in Samana passed the national standardized test for language and math skills at the primary education level (grades 1-8). Additionally, the net enrollment rate for primary education in Samana was only 79% in 2019, compared to the national average of 90%. At the secondary education level (grades 9-12), the net enrollment rate was even lower, at 59%.

The solution/Plan for the school:

To address these issues, we are opening a nature-based Christian school in the summer of 2023, using a US-based curriculum. The school will offer a holistic and experiential education integrating academic excellence, environmental stewardship, and spiritual formation. This innovative approach will seek to provide high-quality education to students in Samana, promote cultural understanding and respect for diversity, and prepare students for success in a global economy. In a country where daily survival can be so difficult, we hope to give the children the one thing no one can take away from them, the gift of education.
