Homeschooler also known as a home educator, is the education of children at home or at a variety of places other than school. Home education is usually conducted by a parent. This is a parent that turns in a Notice of Intent or is Religious Exempt.

Support Group A support group is, as the name suggests, a group where parents can find support and encouragement from others in similar circumstances. Most support groups offer activities such as field trips, social gatherings, meetings for parents, and occasional sports

Homeschool co-op is a group of families who meet together and work cooperatively to achieve common goals. ... Activities and classes that are part of a **co-op** may be led by parents, or the parents may chip in to pay all or some of the teachers and activity leaders.

Facebook Homeschool Group-Virtual Homeschool support, often times gives the options to ask questions about things in the community, questions about curriculum, etc. Sometimes these groups can offer park days, or times for moms to catch coffee together. Facebook groups sometimes do not require membership rather than joining the facebook page.

Pandemic Pod 2020 COVID-19 pandemic has created several variations: Micro schools, Nano schools, Covid pods. The first usually involves hired professionals to teach a small group of kids (similar to one-room schoolhouses). The second is a parent-organized co-operative where families take turns educating and minding their kids during the week. Pandemic Pods is the fashionable term used to describe one of these arrangements where all group members agree to participate under well-defined and strictly enforced health rules. This allows families to still work and not neglect employment in times of crisis.
