



TAG Upper Track (6th - 12th) grade meets Fridays at Coon Rapids Evangelical Free Church from 8:00 am to 2:30/3:30 pm. Classes break throughout the year for MEA, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter.

Student Mandatory Requirements

1. Attend the Upper Track Parent and Student Information Meeting

- Tuesday, August 11, 2026, from 7:30 pm - 8:30 pm.
- If at least one parent and all registered students do not attend this meeting, a \$70 fee will be added to your tuition bill.

Daily Expectations

1. Punctuality and Check-in

- Arrive on campus 5 minutes before the start time.
- Check in at the check-in table upon arrival.
 - Students will wear a name tag for the first couple of weeks.
- Leave campus on time.
 - Campus hours are 7:40 am to 2:30 or 4 pm. When lower track meets (typically on the 1st and 3rd Fridays), campus hours are the later 4 pm time.

2. Show Respect

- **To peers, monitors, and instructors**
 - No teasing, gossiping, swearing, or use of any talk or action that is not glorifying to God.
 - Sexually oriented jokes, gestures, comments, or name-calling are prohibited.
 - Calling people names other than their legal name or personally stated nickname is prohibited.
 - ANYTHING communicated verbally or nonverbally that is deemed inappropriate will be disciplined.

- No PDA (Public Display of Affection), inappropriate touch, roughhousing, wrestling (including arm wrestling), lifting, punching, kicking, bumping, tickling, etc.
- **To the Coon Rapids Evangelical Free Church building**
 - Only athletic shoes with non-marking soles will be allowed in the gym.
 - No running, yelling, or other energetic activity in the hallways.
 - Do not throw balls or other items at the gym's ceiling, windows, lights, or equipment.
 - Only enter the rooms designated for TAG.

3. Classroom

- **Instructors may make their own classroom rules in addition to those in the handbook.**
- **No cell phones**, toys, food, or any other miscellaneous items that become a distraction.
 - These items must be stored away during class.
 - Students using an unapproved device will have it confiscated by the instructor or campus monitor and held until the end of class.
- **Class participation is not optional.**
 - Meaningful, constructive dialogue is encouraged in all classes, along with mutual respect, willingness to listen, and tolerance of opposing views. Respect for individual differences and alternative viewpoints will also be maintained. During PE class, good sportsmanship and fair play are always expected.
- **Listen quietly when instructors are speaking.**
 - This includes no speaking out of turn or over the instructor.
 - Please raise your hand if you have a question or concern in class.

4. Lunch Time

- All students have a lunch break from 11:00 am to 11:30 am.
- Please eat in the cafe or outdoors, weather permitting.
- Practice good stewardship - clean up messes, throw away trash appropriately, and be responsible for personal items.
- Wipe tables clean of any crumbs or liquid.
- Due to food allergies, leave items containing peanuts at home.

5. Dress Code

- No inappropriate dress allowed. Please dress in a way that is edifying to God.
- No immodest attire or shorts with logos/verbiage that would not be appropriate in church or considered disrespectful.

6. Prohibited Substances - no warning will be given in this category

- No tobacco, drugs, alcohol, weapons, vaporizers, or fireworks in the building or anywhere on CREF property.
- Anyone found in possession of any of these items during campus hours could be expelled from TAG for the year, WITHOUT REFUND, pending board review.

Illness Policy

1. Stay home if you have experienced any of the following within the last 24 hours.

- Fever
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Discharge from the eyes, ears, or nose
- Undiagnosed Rash

2. Notify your instructors as soon as possible of your absence.

Disciplinary Policy*

1st Offense	Verbal warning.
2nd Offense	Verbal or written warning, parents will be notified of the offense. Upper track parent(s) need to respond by email or phone to the instructor, administrator, or disciplinary committee member that they are aware of the concern, have discussed appropriate behavior with their teen, and are willing to make restitution and/or apologies if requested.
3rd Offense	Written warning, parents will be notified of the offense. Upper track parent(s) need to respond by email or phone to the instructor, administrator, or disciplinary committee member that they are aware of the concern, have discussed appropriate behavior with their teen, and are willing to make restitution and/or apologies if requested.
4th Offense	Written disciplinary action plan will be given to the student and parent(s).

Actions may include, but are not limited to, requiring a parent to accompany the student or permanently removing the student from classes. There will be no monetary compensation if such actions must be taken.
