

CHASE Academy Course Catalog 2024-2025 School Year

(Version Dated 5/9/24)

This catalog includes information about all classes to be offered at CHASE Academy during the 2024-2025 school year. The school year includes 30 weeks of classes, with a 14-week fall semester (Mondays, September to December), and a 16-week spring semester (Mondays, January to April). Classes are listed on the following pages by period in each grade level, progressing youngest to oldest. For further questions about a class, please contact the instructor.

Class information includes:

Grade Level: listed alphabetically by approximate grade level of material presented (K3/4, K5, E1/2, E3/4, E5/6, MS, and HS)

Course term:

- **Fall** - one semester class, offered during the fall semester only.
- **Spring** – one semester class, offered during the spring semester only.
- **Fall/Spring** – a class in which the material is different each semester, so that the student may take it for the full year, or just one of the semesters.
- **Fall & Spring** – classes in which the same material is presented both semesters; the student should only register for ONE semester.
- **Full year** – a class offered all year, starts in September and ends in April

Curriculum: Source of instruction. Not all classes use a purchased curriculum, and are noted as N/A (Not Applicable). If you are required to purchase a curriculum for the course, it will be listed under “Supplies Needed”.

Class summary: includes brief summary of material to be covered during the class, recommended prerequisite(s), projects, etc. For the upper level sciences please pay careful attention to any math prerequisites.

Homework: Anticipated amount of work to be done at home.

Supplies Needed: These are all supplies **not** included in class fee or supplied by CHASE. These supplies, including text books and/or workbooks, are the responsibility of the family to purchase for the course and **MUST** be purchased prior to the start of classes.

Class Fee: This is the fee required for materials the teacher will be purchasing for the class. Class fees will be collected by CHASE and disbursed to the various teachers.

***Non-participating members:** All one semester classes are \$100.00-\$110.00 (check individual classes for amount), full year classes are \$160.00, and science classes are \$220.00. Class fees are included in this cost.

Copy Fees: A copy fee will be assessed per student per class in any class where a student receives a folder or notebook of copied material, music, or a lap book in lieu of or in addition to a purchased curriculum.

Nursery Fee: A \$5 per child fee will be charged in the nursery. This will cover the cost of wipes, gloves, and animal crackers. Please note that there is a fee for non-member children placed in the nursery. The procedure, paperwork, and fee are explained in the Member Handbook.

Study Hall: Students in the study hall **MUST** have work to do as no talking is permitted. In lieu of a study hall, students may also be with their parent or serve as a teen helper in classes where they are needed. Students will need the approval of leadership to serve as a teen helper.

Science Classes: All science classes at CHASE are taught from a literal six-day creationist perspective. The majority of our elementary, middle, and high school core science classes use Apologia Curriculum. Apologia describes their approach as, “Looking at the world from a creationist position, topics are all presented with an eye towards God’s role in everyday life.”

Circle Time

Homework: N No weekly homework. Will include an occasional light assignment.

Curriculum: N/A

Summary: Throughout the year, the children will have the opportunity to interact during “Circle Time” as we cover various preschool-related themes through songs, stories, and games. The children will also have opportunities to work on their fine motor skills.

Supplies Needed: Backpack, folder, pencil, crayons, scissors, and glue stick. An oversized paint shirt for various art projects may be helpful.

Free Play/Snack

Homework: N No weekly homework. May include an occasional light assignment.

Curriculum: N/A

Summary: Snack time will take place inside during the first part of the class. After that free play will be spent outdoors, weather permitting, so please bring a coat during the winter. If it is raining or snowing, or if the temperature is too low to safely play outside, we will have play time inside.

Supplies Needed: Comfortable clothing, sneakers, and coat. Individually labeled snacks are to be provided by parents.

Math & ABC Time

Homework: N No weekly homework. May include an occasional light assignment.

Curriculum: Math manipulatives, hands on activities, songs, rhymes, poems, and storybooks.

Summary: The children will experience math concepts through the use of manipulatives, games, and songs. They will practice using words such as: greater, lesser, equal, how many, greater than, less than, and ordinal numbers. They will become familiar with the “attributes” of shapes. We will also review the alphabet through games, songs, storybooks, and crafts.

Supplies Needed: Backpack, folder, pencil, crayons, scissors, and glue stick.

We will be covering number recognition, counting to 100, how to use a number line, introduction to money, addition and subtraction up to 10, introduction to months and telling time.

This is a supplemental class and should not be used as a core math class. *The students must have prior instruction in and comprehension of the concepts of addition and subtraction.* (Note: The same class will be taught both semesters. The fall semester is intended for first graders, the spring semester intended for second graders.)

Summary: This is a general science class where we will cover several topics and do hands-on projects. In class we will be learning Newton's Laws, biology, chemistry, botany, and geology.

Summary: This class will introduce basic grammar skills, practice writing skills, and involve in class read-alouds with follow-up questions, worksheets and fun activities done together. It is designed to supplement or enrich what your student is already doing at home for language arts and to expose them to topics they will encounter in grades 3 & 4 writing and grammar studies.

Student must know how to write the alphabet. (Note: The same class will be taught both semesters. The fall semester is geared toward second graders, the spring semester toward first graders.)

American Girl

Homework: L * Light (1-2 hours of homework)

Curriculum: Various

Summary: Delve deeper into the lives of the American Girls. We will be looking at history, geography, values and more. We will complete a variety of projects and crafts. Students will read a book (or more) for the girl being studied. Parent and student can choose how many books they want to read.

Apologia Zoology 1: Flying Creatures

(Class size limit: 12 students)

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Curriculum: *Apologia Exploring Creation with Zoology 1: Flying Creatures*

Summary: Children will begin exploring the dynamics of flight and animal classification, learn about bats, and how to attract birds to your yard and identify them. The course will also include entomology, the study of insects. They'll learn to scientifically classify insects they find in their yard by a simple glance at their wings and other important characteristics. The book is written at a fourth grade reading level and may need to be read by the parent at a rate of 8 pages per week. Students will keep a 3-ring binder/notebook to record what they have learned. Class time will be spent reviewing the material read at home, sharing notebook entries, and doing activities associated with the subject.

Supplies Needed: *Apologia Exploring Creation with Zoology 1* textbook (ISBN: 978-1-932012-61-3), glue stick, pencils, markers/crayons, scissors.

BJU 4

(Class size limit: 10 students)

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Curriculum: BJU's *English 4*

Summary: This writing class will strengthen your child's writing skills through a variety of writing projects.

It is a comprehensive writing and grammar course when the parent follows through with the writing and grammar assignments throughout the week. Spelling practice is not included. We will complete eight writing projects throughout the year, taking each project through the writing process. Writing homework will involve completing one step in the writing process each week (prewriting, drafting, revising/editing, final copy) and should generally take about 15-30 minutes. Each week we will also introduce a grammar concept which should be practiced during the week using the BJU *English 4* worktext. These grammar assignments are an essential part of the course, will require time in addition to time spent on writing projects, and must be supervised and corrected by a parent. Journal writing will also be encouraged and a journal entry will be started most Monday mornings (the class fee includes the cost of the journal). This class will be most effective if the parent schedules 20 minutes of work time for 3 or 4 days during the week. Please note the worktext is required for the class.

****We have used this text several years in the past and have found that it works well for both 3rd and 4th graders.**

Supplies Needed: BJU's *English 4* worktext (2nd Edition), ISBN #978-1-59166-916-6. Parents have the option of purchasing the BJU *English 4* (2nd Edition) Teacher's Edition to be used in grading grammar assignments, although this is not essential. A Teacher's Edition will be available during the CHASE Day on Mondays. The teacher will supply each student with a writing folder and journal on the first day of class.

Homework: L * Light (1-2 hours of homework)

Curriculum: Various

Summary: This class will provide opportunities for students to improve their understanding and recall of basic math facts and concepts. Class time will be spent on games and activities to make learning math facts fun! This is a supplemental class and should not be used as a core math class.

Grammar & Basic IEW

Homework M ** Moderate (2-3 hours of homework)

Curriculum: *Adventures in Writing*

Summary: This class will write about inventions, explorers, historical events, animals, and fables. This is a theme-based writing curriculum that teaches how to construct paragraphs. The student will learn to create an outline from the source texts and pictures provided in the lesson book. Then the students will verbally state their paragraph using their outline. Finally they will

write out the paragraph and check it using the checklist provided. Throughout the lessons, new style concepts, vocabulary, and structure concepts will be taught that will need to be incorporated into the paragraphs. The lessons will be taught at CHASE and the parent will review the lesson with the student during the week.

**The homework will be broken down into 4 days. Each week there is a detailed 4 day homework list so the student can achieve the written paragraph or outlines and the learning of the new concepts in small chunks. The parent will need to supervise the writing process by reading the student lesson book (or the teacher's book if you decide to purchase it), assisting with the writing, and correcting the homework. Please note the worktext is required for the class. Some grammar will be covered; however, the emphasis will be on writing. You will want to use a separate grammar course in addition to this class.

Hero Tales

Homework: L * Light (1-2 hours of homework)

Curriculum: *Hero Tales: A Family Treasury of True Stories from the Lives of Christian Heroes*

Summary: Delve deeper into the lives of 15 key Christian heroes with this unit study curriculum. Looking at history, geography, values, literary analysis, and more, we will complete a variety of projects. There will be required reading and assignments each week, as well as optional assignments you can do if you choose.

Supplies Needed: *Hero Tales: A Family Treasury of True Stories from the Lives of Christian Heroes*, pencil, crayons or colored pencils, scissors, and a glue stick.

Homework: L * Light (1-2 hours of homework)

Curriculum: *The Body Book*

Summary: Students will create paper models of several body systems, which will enable them to associate the name of a body part with what it looks like, where it is located in the body and what it does. We will place each of these models together on poster board to form a life size human body model with its organs and systems. We will be playing review games as time permits. This class will require the student to follow directions. They must label (some labeling will already be done), color, cut and tape together paper body parts.

Class size limit: 12 students

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Curriculum: *Exploring Creation with Human Anatomy and Physiology* textbook

We will not be using the notebooking journal, so please do not purchase one. Questions and activities will be on the website each week to print out for homework!

Summary: This unique course explores the human body using engaging text, exciting activities, interesting experiments, and proven methods to help your students remember what they've learned. We cover many of the body's systems in depth. Each student will be expected to choose an organ and complete a diorama (small project) about that organ and present it to the class. Students will also work throughout the year making his/her own game about the human body for the learning fair. During the week, students will need to read the assigned text and complete assigned homework. Class time will be devoted to reviewing the material read at home and doing activities and experiments. Summary: This third book in the zoology series takes students on a safari through jungles, deserts, forests, farms, and even their own backyard to explore, examine, and enjoy the enchanting creatures God designed to inhabit the terrain. Students will discover the amazing animals from primates to parasites, kangaroos to caimans, and turtles to terrifying T-Rexes—this safari doesn't end there! Students will also keep a record of where each animal is found on a map and learn to identify animal tracks. Summary: This class will use this easy-to-use visual guide to cover the basics of the Microsoft programs Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Students MUST bring their laptops to class each week. There will be a final presentation due at the end of the course.

Homework: M ** Moderate (2-3 hours of homework)

Curriculum: Fundamentals of Photography by Great Courses

Summary: (Note: The same course will be taught both semesters.) We will be watching a video series together in class, from Great Courses called the Fundamentals of Photography. The class will receive photography challenges based on the specific skills we cover in class. The emphasis of this class will be to photograph and practice what they are learning. The students will be required to photograph 1 to 2 hours every week and submit their favorite work to our class's shared Google photo album. The class fee will cover getting selected photos printed.

Physical Science

(Class Size limit: 12 students)

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Curriculum: *Apologia Exploring Creation with Physical Science 3rd Edition*

Summary: The course covers topics of the atmosphere, the hydrosphere, weather, the structure of the earth, environmentalism, the physics of motion, Newton's Laws, gravity, and the solar system. The math prerequisite for the class is 7th grade math. Each week students can expect some combination of reading and answering questions from the text, completing workpages and study guides in the notebook (1-2 pages) to reinforce the material, and writing a lab report or a lab summary. This requires that the student follow the daily syllabus and stay on track. Students should plan on spending approximately 30-45 minutes each day on Science. Tests will be taken at home (monitored by parent) and will be turned in for grading. There will also be occasional quizzes given in class.

Summary: We will be learning basic hand and machine sewing techniques while making a table runner, 3 pot holders or small quilt depending on the students interest. We will use the Book "I Can't Believe I'm Quilting" by Pat Sloan . A very useful tool for reviewing assignments at home.

Algebra 2

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Curriculum: Math-U-See Algebra 2

Summary: This class will use Algebra 2 published by Math-U-See, Inc. Math-U-See Algebra 2 integrates text, DVD, and manipulatives to teach all basic algebra concepts. These include solving for an unknown; solving simultaneous equations by graphing, substitution, and elimination; square roots; and dividing polynomials.

*Pre-Requisite: Students must have completed Algebra 1.

BiblioPlan Year 1: Ancient

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Curriculum: BiblioPlan – Year 1: *Consider the Years* text, 1 per family, NOT needed in class), Available in ebook and hard copy. I highly recommend the print version. Families in the past who have purchased the ebook struggled and at least one ended up purchasing the hard copy.- Hands On Maps for Advanced (1 per student)

Summary: BiblioPlan covers history and geography from a Biblical, creationist perspective. BiblioPlan is designed to be a 4-year rotation with new learning occurring when repeating the same time period because the student brings their own additional knowledge and experience, as well as questions being more complex for older kids. Additionally, what is done as homework in one cycle becomes the class focus for the next cycle and vice versa. BiblioPlan has additional materials for the younger student should you want to do history together as a family.

Ancients covers Creation through the fall of the Roman Empire. Classes will consist of lecture/PowerPoints, games, and activities. Homework will involve reading from the Bible, the new text, completing a homework page or interactive notebook page or mini-project, and 1-2 maps. Maps for ancients are generally lighter than the last 2 years of the cycle. They will complete one project each semester. Grades will be determined by projects, tests, and weekly homework.

This course is equivalent to 1 credit each of World history and ¼ World Geography.

Supplies: Above required curriculum, binder or Art Pad. I am not a fan of their workbook, so we'll do our own questions and that can be kept in either a 3-ring binder or an art pad if you have an artsy kid who prefers to illustrate.

Biology

(Class size limit: 12 students)

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)- a minimum of one hour per day

Curriculum: Apologia *Exploring Creation with Biology*, 2nd edition

Summary: This class provides a strong background in scientific method, the five-kingdom classification scheme, microscopy, biochemistry, cellular biology, molecular and Mendelian genetics, evolution, dissection, and ecosystems. It also provides a complete survey of the five kingdoms in Creation. This class does not contain a discussion of human anatomy and physiology. Dissection is included in the class. Science roots to accompany the course will be taught. Frequent quizzing will be included. ***Note:** Quizzes need to have a passing grade to participate in dissections.

Supplies Needed: Apologia *Exploring Creation with Biology*, 2nd edition (ISBN 978-1-932012) text, Solutions and Test manual, and colored pencils – at least a 24 pack. The Companion CD-ROM is recommended, but not required.

Chemistry (lecture & lab)

Homework: E *** Extensive (Daily homework)

Instructor: Galen Hershey (Paid Instructor)

Curriculum: *Introductory Chemistry: A Foundation*, 4th Edition * See note below*

Summary: This course will be offered as a **2-period block** consisting of lecture during 4th period and labs during 5th period. The course covers all aspects of high school Chemistry including atomic structure, nomenclature, reactions, aqueous solutions, chemical composition, atomic theory, stoichiometry, chemical bonding, mass calculations, gases, solutions, orbitals, polarity and ionic bonding, Lewis structures, acids and bases, equilibrium, electrochemistry, oxidation and reduction reactions, radioactivity, and intro to organic and biochemistry. Classes consist of lectures, labs, and homework review. Students are assigned homework, lab reports and periodic take home tests. All chemicals, lab equipment and supplies will be provided. ***Math Prerequisite:** *This class requires the ability to manipulate equations. Students need to be strong in this area to be successful in this class. Students must have successfully completed Algebra I prior to taking this class.*

Supplies Needed: Students will need the textbook, *Introductory Chemistry: A Foundation*, 4th Edition (ISBN#: 978-0395955369). **CHASE owns a limited number of these textbooks; contact the class coordinator if you would like to request to borrow one for the year.**

Students will also need a scientific calculator capable of logarithmic functions (No prior knowledge of logarithm functions is needed), a 3-ring binder with lined paper (for taking notes and homework problems), a pencil, and colored pencils.

Summary: This class will provide a general review of grammar and composition skills. Class will consist of worksheets, workbook assignments, activities, paragraph writing, and at least one five-paragraph essay. Note: The same course will be taught in the Fall and Spring semesters.

Curriculum: varied. This semester we will be studying a spiritual allegory, and since the MS/HS classes are studying Ancient History, we will examine two excerpts from literary pieces that were written during the ancient history time period. We will compare both pieces to scripture, God's absolute word. We will also read a biography of John Paton, a Scottish missionary that served among the cannibals in New Hebrides. There will be a semester project. Details will be given the first day of class.

Summary: Our goal is to introduce books and authors that encourage our students to see God working through the lives of regular individuals like you and me. We hope that they will develop a strong Biblical worldview that will help them discern the things of God from the lies of the devil. We understand that some families want their students to read the Classics. We will briefly include a small overview of a classic this year but it will be strongly examined with a Biblical scope and not a celebration of good writing. In addition to reading the novels, this course may include an oral report, essays, possible quizzes, and tested vocabulary/comprehension learning. **Note this is a high school level course. Some of these selections may contain subjects that would be sensitive in nature. However, they will be approached through a Christian perspective.

Fall: *Hinds' Feet on High Places*, by Hannah Hurnard (ISBN:978-0-8423-1394-0), *Bible* reading Genesis 1-11, an printed excerpt of *Epic of Gilgamesh*, printed excerpt from *Hammurabi's Code* and more scripture reading, biography of *John Paton* (waiting for the isbn# this might have to be purchased by Chase)

Spring: *Pilgrim's Progress*, by John Bunyan (*NOTE: if there are students that have already read this, I am prepared to replace it with *Screwtape Letters*, by C.S. Lewis), *Bible* as we examine excerpts from the following works: *The Iliad* by Homer, and *The Odyssey* by Homer, and *Cat of Bubastes*, by G.A. Henty (**Kindle version is free as of today 3/27/24 on Amazon**)

Logic

Homework: M ** Moderate (2-3 days of homework)

Curriculum: *Master Books Introduction to Logic*

Summary: This course will challenge and inspire students to be able to defend their faith. To think logically is to think, in a sense, like God thinks. By studying logic, we are also studying Theology! Logic is the study of the principles of correct reasoning. To be logical, is to think

rightly. But who decides what is the “right” way to think? What is the standard by which we judge a particular line of reasoning to be correct or incorrect? God determines the correct way to reason because He is the standard for all truth claims. How can we know how God thinks? God has told us in the Bible! We must base our thinking on His thinking; therefore, Bible study is an important part of becoming logical. In this course we will be memorizing 25 Scripture verses and examining 25 of the most common informal fallacies. Our goal is to learn some things about the mind of God, so that we can think in a way that is consistent with His character.

Personal Finance

Curriculum: *Foundations in Personal Finance: 4th Edition for Homeschool Online Edition*

Summary: This course contains 4 main units which will review saving and budgeting, credit and debt, financial planning and insurance, income, taxes, and giving. In addition to online streamed lessons taught by Dave Ramsey and his team, this course uses student workbook exercises to help students gain a working understanding of a variety of financial topics and to apply this knowledge to their personal financial situations. Students will also use critical thinking skills and class discussion to evaluate this material and compare and contrast it with other approaches to money management and Christian stewardship. Chase will be purchasing a class subscription, which will provide all that you need for the class.

Activities will vary depending on weather, indoor/outdoor activity, etc. We will do as much outdoor activity as possible. This class will do different things during the fall and spring semesters.
