

Course Description:

SPANISH 1

2021-22

Students will learn basic introductory Spanish by focusing on four key areas of foreign language learning: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. A strong foundation for Spanish pronunciation and grammar will be established early in the course. Students will engage in regular Spanish conversational strategies, listen to multimedia videos, read and write about Hispanic culture and geography, and memorize vocabulary. Throughout this course, students should expect to take frequent vocabulary quizzes, a midterm and final exam, 1-2 scheduled phone conversation assessments with the teacher per semester, and make regular short conversational presentations. This course will include many fun and engaging games and interactive exercises to tap into multiple learning styles. The main purpose of this course is to help students become familiar with the Spanish language, culture, and grammar, and be able to carry on a simple conversation with confidence.
