Board Game Theory II(Gr. 5-12)- Students will be introduced to a different set of board game mechanics in this class than what is covered in the first Board Game Theory class. There will be weekly How To Play videos that need to be watched at home before class. Videos will be sent out on the Friday before class. (Board Game Theory 1 is NOT a prerequisite for this class.) Please note that food will not be permitted during this class. **Cost = \$30**

Apologia Science-Land Animals of the Sixth Day(Gr. 6-8)(20 wk)-We will study Apologia's Land Animals curriculum this year. Graphic Design 101(Gr. 6-12)- Graphic Design is used to create brochures, business cards, and other marketing materials, design web-sites, and other digital applications. Teaching will focus on elements of design, including, but not limited to:

- Unity
- Balance
- Contrast
- Proportion
- Movement or Rhythm
- Line
- Shading and Color

Students should bring a laptop computer to class with either a Word(or comparable Word program) and/or Adobe downloaded. These programs are specifically chosen to encourage student generated work, not AI work. To improve focus, students will be turning WIFI off during class. Programs should be able to run without an internet connection. Students should have a basic working knowledge of the digital program they will be using and/or be willing to self-teach themselves the technical aspects of the program. Teaching will focus on the art forms listed above. Student supplies: Laptop, sketchbook or notebook, colored pencils, pens, and pencils. **This class is a repeat of the fall semester. Class cost: \$80**

Roman Empire-82 BC-AD 565(Gr. 6-12)(30 wks)-This course will thoroughly explore the Roman Empire, in all its splendor and tragedy. Students will gain a better understanding of its formation, the leaders that brought it to its zenith, as well as those who drove it to its eventual demise. Woodburning (Gr. 7-12)-Middle School and High School students will learn about the art form of pyrography using different burning tips and different types of surfaces. Classes will include: burning techniques, transferring drawings and images, shadows and highlights, textures, positive and negative space, landscapes, animals, how to add color and related art history. **Class Fee: \$190 (\$150 +\$40 material fee) **This class is not open for additional students in the spring.**

Cake Decorating (Gr. 8-12)- Come and learn the art of cake decorating! Students will make cakes and work with buttercream, fondant, gum paste, ganache, and more, culminating in a final project which will be displayed on the last day of co-op. **Class cost: \$85 (\$45 class, \$40 supplies)**

Algebra I(Gr. 8-10)(30 wks)- Prerequisite: Completion of Pre-Algebra or teacher approval. This course is taught based on MathUSee Algebra I Legacy Edition. This is a fast paced Algebra I class that is meant to supplement your student's Algebra I education that is already taking place in the home. This will be done by checking for understanding, mini lessons and reinforcement of concepts through song and other interactive means while also developing good problem solving skills. Students will be required to actively watch 1 video lesson per chapter, complete worksheets & tests outside of class. **Class Cost to Instructor: \$170 **This class is not open for additional students in the spring.**

Apologia Chemistry Lab (Gr. 9-12)(2hr-30wks)-This two-hour lab class accompanies the Apologia "Exploring Creation with Chemistry" (3rd edition) curriculum. Class

time will be used to complete all the laboratory exercises, to reinforce and supplement the concepts of the text and to review practice problems. A course grade will be given. Course Prerequisite: successful completion of Algebra1 **Cost: \$190 **This class is not open for additional students in the spring.**

Intro to Forensic Science (Gr. 9-12)- Mystery Science: The Case of the Missing Museum Artifact. Join the CSI team to solve a daring museum heist! Over 10 weeks, students will learn real forensic science techniques—dusting for fingerprints, analyzing hair and fibers, testing mysterious powders, decoding digital clues, creating a dna model, analyzing blood splatter and handwriting, intro to profiling suspects and more. Each week builds toward cracking the case in a full mock crime scene. Perfect for curious minds who love science, puzzles, and hands-on investigation. **Cost- \$50**

We will study countries, land, people, animals and customs of the continent of Asia and the countries in the Middle East. **Class cost = \$35**

Making Math Memorable (Gr. K-2)- Math can actually be FUN! This class will focus on making math memorable and fun through a variety of engaging hands-on activities which will include manipulatives, STEM projects, learning games, and math-centered literature. Support will be given for the memorization of basic addition/subtraction facts. Number sense, critical thinking, and core math concepts for this level will be reinforced, math will be related to real life, and most of all, much FUN will be had!

Watercolor (Gr. 1-3)- In this course the student will be equipped with techniques like washes and brush control, learn the basics of color theory and values, and be encouraged to observe God's creation and notice light, color, dynamics and think about how they would translate that onto paper. Watercolor is a fun medium for all levels but is a great starting point for beginner artists stepping into the color world. **Course Fee - \$40 (includes all materials except for palette)**

Humphrey's Happenings (Gr. 2-4)- This class will be reading the book The World According to Humphrey to develop language arts skills through class discussions, vocabulary, and comprehension activities. Using graphic organizers, students will develop strategies that include character analysis, summarizing, cause and effect, and sequencing. Books will be provided for students to use. **Class Fee: \$25**

Elementary Chorus (Gr. 2-7)- Elementary chorus is an excellent way to help your child feel comfortable and confident singing! We sing songs based on scripture, songs for learning/memorizing facts, and songs just for fun. We use games and movement activities to help practice keeping the steady beat, explore our voices, and have fun together! Students are constantly given opportunities to explore and develop their full vocal range. They learn to sing appropriately for a variety of styles/genres, singing in unison and in 2-part harmony. They will also be introduced to solfege (do-re-mi) and reading music. **Cost- \$50**

Oil Pastel Art Creation (Gr. 4-6)- Oil pastels are in stick form and produce vibrant colors that can be manipulated in many ways. In this class students will explore oil pastels through colorful art projects, learning drawing skills, blending, shading, and creative expression. Students will also learn special oil pastel techniques such as scumbling, feathering and a scratch technique called sgraffito. Since these are OIL pastels that could damage clothing, each student should bring an art smock or old large t-shirt each week. **Cost: \$70 (Class fee\$50+\$20 supply fee)**

Embroidery (Gr. 4-12)- We will learn the basics of hand embroidery for beginners. This will include learning a variety of stitches and completing an embroidery project or 2. **Cost = \$40, supplies are included in the class cost.**

In this 10-week beginner drama class, students will learn the basics of acting through fun games, improvisation, and creative storytelling. Each class will build confidence, teamwork, and performance skills as we practice voice projection, movement, and character development. The session will conclude with a short skit performed for family and friends during the final class. No experience needed—just a willingness to imagine, create, and have fun! **\$40 including supplies**

More examination of the importance of both the role of the battle at Gettysburg and the hardships of Valley Forge. Our studies will continue to be

"hands-on." ***This class is a repeat of the fall semester. Class cost = \$80 (\$65/ 10 week term + \$15 Materials)**

Science Olympiad (Gr. 6-9)(30 wks)-Join with other STEM enthusiasts to create the first ever TEACH Science Olympiad Division B team. Each fall, Science Olympiad publishes a list of events which include lab experiences, knowledge tests, and building challenges (like balsa bridges or mousetrap cars). Our team would prepare entries for as many of the events as we wished and compete in the regional Science Olympiad (held at Millersville University on a Saturday early Spring 2026.) Class time at co-op would consist of working on and testing our builds, gaining familiarity with lab practices, equipment, and procedures which would be useful in completing lab challenges, and creating team t-shirts (which we will screen print ourselves). Students who wish to enter the knowledge portions will receive study guides to work on outside co op. Co-op time remaining after the regional competition will be spent preparing for an in-class kinetic sculpture race. **Cost- \$180 (includes supplies, custom t-shirt, and Science Olympiad registration) **This class is not open for additional students in the spring.**

Creative Writing (Gr. 7-9)- The creative writing class is designed to develop the writing skills of the students through fun, creative exercises. They will explore multiple forms of writing—including descriptive pieces, personal narratives, persuasive essays, and poetry—while learning to express ideas with clarity and creativity. **Cost- \$45**

We will focus on the formation & path of storms and the weather that attends them. You'll begin to learn how to forecast and there will be a forecasting competition. ****This class is open for additional students in the spring. Cost for the spring semester- \$50**

This is meant to supplement your student's Geometry education that is already taking place in the home. This will be done by checking for understanding, mini lessons and reinforcement of concepts through song and other interactive means while also developing good problem solving skills. Students will be required to actively watch 1 video lesson per chapter, complete worksheets & tests outside of

class. **Class Cost to Instructor: \$170 **This class is not open for additional students in the spring.**

Church History From 33AD to 1517- (Gr. 9-12)(30 wks)- "I will build My Church and the gates of hell will not prevail against it." These words of Jesus affix importance to the Church and its place in history. This class will trace the purpose of the Sovereign God who builds His Church through the ages despite its challenges and persecution from within and without. We will begin our journey with a mini-study of Acts 1-13 in order to set the foundation for the origin of the Church. Because God is the God of all history, as we study the Church, we'll also be including relevant cultural and geographic information as well as pertinent world events and figures. Fundamentals of Music (Gr. K-2)-The purpose of this class is to focus on the most important early-childhood music skills which are foundational for all other musical learning, particularly internalizing the steady beat and "activating" the head voice. The lessons will build on the repertoire, singing games, and concepts covered in previous semesters, but students who took the class previously are welcome to take it again as it will be new content each semester. Areas of focus: steady beat, movement, vocal exploration, singing alone and with others, long/short, high/low, fast/slow, loud/soft, and reading and notating quarter and eighth note rhythms. Additional areas of exposure: rhythming words, cross-body movement/clapping, pattern recognition, language arts, literature (children's books to fit the themes), and classical music. There will also be an opportunity for each child to get a "recital ticket." This is a bit like musical "show and tell." Students can either perform by singing or playing an instrument for the class or they can bring in an instrument from home to show the class (toy/handmade instruments are fine!). This is not required and is very casual. The purposes are to encourage interest in music at home and to give the students an opportunity to talk/sing/perform in front of their classmates. *The last class will include a short performance for anyone who would like to attend.* **Cost: \$50**

Intro to the Seven Elements of Art(Gr. K-2)- Art program will introduce students to the seven elements of art including lines, shapes, color, value, texture, form, and space through fun art projects. **Class Cost: \$70 (Class fee \$50 + \$20 supply fee)**

In this hands-on science and nature class, students will become “Sprout Detectives” as they work to solve the mystery of what they’re growing. Each student will plant their own set of mystery seeds and use their detective journal to make weekly observations, record evidence, and build hypotheses about what their plant might be. Throughout the 10 weeks, we’ll explore plant science concepts including seed structure, germination, plant needs, and growth cycles — all through engaging, age-appropriate activities. Students will sketch, measure, compare, and even do mini-experiments as their sprouts grow. Throughout the course, the big mystery will be revealed of what seeds we were growing! We will learn different ways to incorporate what we grew into our kitchen and different ways to eat it. Students will grow multiple plants that they can take home to transplant in their own garden or container pot and also recipes that they can eventually use with parent supervision. Students will:

- Plant and care for their own mystery seeds
- Keep a detective-style observation journal
- Use calendar math during observations
- Use a standard ruler and work on measurement
- Learn key plant science concepts through hands-on exploration
- Build patience, curiosity, and scientific thinking skills
- Work collaboratively while solving their plant mystery

Watercolor(Gr. 5-7)-In this course the student will be equipped with techniques like washes and brush control, review color theory and values, and be encouraged to observe God's creation and notice light, color, dynamics and think about how they would translate that onto paper.
