Take the Challenge: Higher level Grammar and Writing (30 wks) (Gr. 10-12)- How do clauses and phrases affect our communication? How do modifiers enhance our abilities to express our thoughts in both oral and written form? By answering these questions we will strengthen our communication. We will also address and practice various types of and purposes for writing. Join the class, and we'll stretch our skills together!

Cost for class: \$200

Math Games and Activities (Gr. PreK-1)-

Students will participate in a variety of games and activities that focus on identifying and comparing numbers, place value, addition, subtraction, calendar, and problem solving.

Class Cost = \$25

Hands On Science (Gr. K-2)- In this class, we will be introducing various scientific topics - touching on animal science, meteorology, physics, botany, plus more - with a focus on interactive activities and encouragement to ask all of the "how?" and "why?" questions. Each week, we will introduce a new scientific concept and then explore how it works with experiments and hands-on activities! Note for the parents who have had their children in our class before: We will be repeating about half of the topics and experiments that we covered in the 2024/2025 classes. There will be some new topics and concepts covered but about half of them will be a repeat. **Class cost: \$50**

Geography- Asia (Gr. 2-4)- We will study countries, land, people, animals and customs of the continent of Asia. **Cost: \$35**

More Than Moccasins (Gr. 3-5)- Discover who the Native Americans were in this class! We will learn about many different tribes from across the U.S. We'll discuss culture, food, tools, customs, and much more. Some days we will make a craft. **Class cost- \$45**

Making Math Memorable (Gr. 4-6)- Math can actually be FUN! This class will focus on making math memorable and fun through a variety of engaging hands-on activities which will include manipulatives, STEM projects, learning games, and math-centered literature. Logic, critical thinking, and core math concepts for this level will be reinforced, math will be related to real life, and most of all, much FUN will be had!

Class cost: \$50 (\$35 + \$15 materials fee)

Writing the Research Paper (Gr. 4-6)- In this class, students will learn how to write a book report and a simple research paper. They'll discover how to gather information, organize their ideas using basic outlines, take notes, write clearly, and create a bibliography. Step by step, they'll gain confidence in turning research into well-structured writing. **Class Cost = \$50 (\$45 + \$5 supplies)**

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Calligraphy and Creative Lettering (Gr. 4-adult)-

Examine and practice various lettering styles and utensils in calligraphy; goal of one finished 'standard' work of calligraphy. Using learned techniques, design and complete a more creative, individual piece of lettered artwork. Tools available. Students may bring their own calligraphy pens. Preference given to students - adults welcome if class size permits.

Class fee = \$30

Ancient Greece (Gr. 5-7)- In this class your student will learn about Ancient Greece. We'll talk about everything from its geography, birth of democracy, the Parthenon, wars, art, city-states, and much more. Each student will have a notebook full of worksheets completed in class, and we'll add a few fun projects to solidify their learning. **Cost = \$45**

Advanced Board Games (Gr. 5-12)- Students will play through 4-5 advanced strategy board games over the 10 weeks of class. These games help students use logic, critical thinking, strategy and calculate probability in a fun environment. How many games are played will depend on how quickly each game gets completed. There will be how to play videos that will need to be watched before class. Prerequisite of having taken at least one Board Game Theory class or prior permission from the teacher. **Cost: \$30**

Apologia Science: Land Animals of the Sixth Day (20 wks)(Gr. 6-8)- We will study Apologia's Land Animals curriculum this year. Students will explore the animals God created on the 6th day of creation: worms, dinosaurs, lions, horses... and everything in between! We will do many hands-on activities to reinforce the lessons.

Apologia textbook is required for the class. Notebooking Journal is recommended, but not required. **Cost: \$110 (for entire 20 week course and supplies).**

Middle and High School Choir (Gr. 6-adult)-

Grow the musical gifts God has given to you! We will explore the foundations of healthy vocal technique and choral singing through diverse musical styles and repertoire. The term will culminate in a public presentation of our music, usually at the Glick's Greenhouse Poinsettia Festival. Adult singers are very welcome! **Cost: \$70 (\$60 + \$10 materials fee)**

Graphic Design 101 (Gr. 6-12)- This class is used to create brochures, business cards, and other marketing materials, design web-sites, and other digital applications. Teaching will focus on elements of design, including, but not limited to: Unity, Balance, Contrast, Proportion, Movement or Rhythm, Line, Shading and Color. Students should bring a laptop computer to class with either a Word(or comparable Word program) and/or Adobe downloaded. These programs are specifically chosen to encourage student generated work, not AI work. To improve focus, students will be turning WIFI off during class. Programs should be able to run without an internet connection. Students should have a basic working knowledge of the digital program they will be using and/or be willing to self-teach themselves the technical aspects of the program. Teaching will focus on the art forms listed above. Student supplies: Laptop, sketchbook or notebook, colored pencils, pens, and pencils. **Class cost: \$80**

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Roman Empire-82 BC - AD 565 (30 wks)(Gr. 6-12)- This course will thoroughly explore the Roman Empire, in all its splendor and tragedy. Students will gain a better understanding of its formation, the leaders that brought it to its zenith, as well as those who drove it to its eventual demise. Students will also receive insights into Roman culture and its impact on Western society. **Class Fee: \$120**

Holiday Baking (Gr. 7-12)- Bake your way through a year of holidays! Each week students will learn how to prepare a sweet treat or dessert corresponding with that week's chosen holiday. Ingredients will be provided, students may be required to bring utensils, hand mixers or baking sheets. Basic knowledge of following a recipe recommended. Cannot accommodate for dietary restrictions. **Cost is \$70 (\$30 class/\$40 materials).**

Woodburning (30 wks)(Gr. 7-12)- Middle School and High School students will learn about the art form of pyrography using different burning tips and different types of surfaces. Classes will include: burning techniques, transferring drawings and images, shadows and highlights, textures, positive and negative space, landscapes, animals, how to add color and related art history. **Class Fee: \$190 (\$150 +\$40 material fee)**

Algebra I (30 wks) (Gr. 8-10)- Prerequisite: Completion of Pre-Algebra or teacher approval. This course is taught based on MathUSee Algebra I Legacy Edition. This is a fast paced Algebra I class that is meant to supplement your student's Algebra I education that is already taking place in the home. This will be done by checking for understanding, mini lessons and

reinforcement of concepts through song and other interactive means while also developing good problem solving skills. Students will be required to actively watch 1 video lesson per chapter, complete worksheets & tests outside of class. Required Material: MathUSee. [Algebra I: Legacy Edition Student Workbook and Tests \(\\$48\)](#) & [Algebra I: Legacy Edition Online Instruction with Video \(\\$41.40\)](#). Please purchase these items prior to class.

Class Cost to instructor: \$170

Apologia Chemistry Lab (2 hr-30 wks) (Gr. 9-12)- This two-hour lab class accompanies the Apologia "Exploring Creation with Chemistry" (3rd edition) curriculum. Class time will be used to complete all the laboratory exercises, to reinforce and supplement the concepts of the text and to review practice problems. A course grade will be given. **Course Prerequisite:** successful completion of Algebra 1 **Cost: \$190 (textbook rental available for additional \$20)**

Pre-engineering- Electricity (30 wks) (Gr. 9-12)- **Prerequisite** for Pre-engineering Electricity- A, C, or better in Algebra. You'll learn what electricity is, how it acts, how to work with it safely. We'll take the mystery out of concepts like voltage, current, resistance, power, Ohm's Law, series, parallel & combination circuits. You'll explore interesting devices like alternators, capacitors, inductors, transformers, diodes, LEDs and transistors. There will be lots of demonstrations including a 350,000 volt Tesla coil. Students may build a variety of electrical/electronic projects, though project work is not required. **Class cost = \$150**

Shhh! We're Reading and Crafting (Gr. PreK-1)-

We will read a variety of treasured classics, stories that will make you giggle, and more. Join us each week for a story time and a craft. **Class cost: \$30**

Geography- Asia (Gr. K-2)- We will study the countries, land, people, animals and customs of the continent of Asia.

Class cost = \$35

Chocolate Fever Language Arts (Gr. 2-4)-

Can you ever have too much of a good thing? Join Henry Green as he discovers the answer to this question in the novel Chocolate Fever. We develop language arts skills through class discussions, comprehension activities, vocabulary and a chocolate taste test. Completing graphic organizers through written work and illustrations, as well as other writing prompts and activities that relate to the book will also be a part of the class. Books will be provided for students to use. **Class Fee: \$25**

Meet Felicity: An American Girl (Gr. 2-4)- Join us as we read through "Meet Felicity: An American Girl". We will discuss what life was like for a colonial girl, make some crafts, and have a tea party at the end of the semester. You do not need to have this book to take this class.

Cost: \$40

Elementary Chorus (Gr. 2-7)- This session will build on the repertoire, singing games, and concepts covered in the spring class. We will sing songs based on scripture, songs for learning/memorizing facts, and songs just for fun. In addition to standing up front and

singing, we mix it up with games and movement activities to help practice keeping the steady beat, explore our voices, and have fun together! The last class will include a short performance.

Cost is \$50

Making Math Memorable (Gr. 3-5)- Math can actually be FUN! This class will focus on making math memorable and fun through a variety of engaging hands-on activities which will include manipulatives, STEM projects, learning games, and math-centered literature. Support will be given for the memorization of basic addition/subtraction facts. Number sense, critical thinking, and core math concepts for this level will be reinforced, math will be related to real life, and most of all, much FUN will be had!

Tuition: \$50 (\$35 + \$15 materials fee)

Artistic Adventures (Gr. 5-6)- Students will have an opportunity to express their creativity while learning a variety of art concepts and media skills. Subjects covered will include color theory, texture, line, perspective, basic shapes, value, art vocabulary and related art history. Projects will include oil pastel, drawing, painting, mixed media, and more. **Class Fee: \$80 (\$50 + \$30 material fee)**

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Kitchen Basics (Gr. 5-7)- This class will teach the basics of working in the kitchen. We will go over kitchen safety, and teach basic food prep techniques (example: peeling, chopping, grating, mixing, etc.) to build your child's confidence in the kitchen. Most weeks, but not every week, they will go home with a dish or snack to finish baking/cooking at home. Students will need to bring basic tools along to class each week, and we may ask parents to supply specific tools each week as well. * This class is a repeat of the Spring 2025 semester
Class fee: \$100 (includes class fee and materials)

Board Game Theory I (Gr. 5-12)- Students will learn about at least 10 of the most commonly used mechanics in board games. Being able to correctly identify what mechanics are being employed by different board games will increase your ability to understand how the game plays, play effectively, and learn other games that use similar mechanics with ease. After learning about the mechanic we will play a game that heavily features the mechanic that we learned about. (There will be a weekly YouTube video to watch with instructions on how to play the coming week's game, so we can spend more time discussing the mechanic and how it is shown in the game instead of going over the rules of how to play.) No food is allowed in this class. **Class cost \$30**

PA History (Gr. 5-adult)- Content will meet PA History state requirements. Teaching will focus on the Pennsylvania State Capital, William Penn's History, PA Folk Art, Philadelphia Architecture, and Chester & Lancaster County local art themes. Additional content will be investigated while building on themes

introduced in the first level class. More examination of the importance of both the role of the battle at Gettysburg and the hardships of Valley Forge. Our studies will continue to be "hands-on." *This class is a repeat of the spring. **Class cost = \$80 (\$65 + \$15 Materials)**

Life Draw I (Gr. 5-12)- Drawing actual objects to learn line, shape, value, color, and perspective. **Pencils available for purchase (usually \$5); not required. Class fee = \$30**

Science Olympiad (30 wks)(Gr. 6-8)- Join with other STEM enthusiasts to create the first ever TEACH Science Olympiad Division B team. Each fall, Science Olympiad publishes a list of events which include lab experiences, knowledge tests, and building challenges (like balsa bridges or mousetrap cars). Our team would prepare entries for as many of the events as we wished and compete in the regional Science Olympiad (held at Millersville University on a Saturday early Spring 2026.) Class time at co-op would consist of working on and testing our builds, gaining familiarity with lab practices, equipment, and procedures which would be useful in completing lab challenges, and creating team t-shirts (which we will screen print ourselves). Students who wish to enter the knowledge portions will receive study guides to work on outside co op. Co-op time remaining after the regional competition will be spent preparing for an in-class kinetic sculpture race. **Cost- \$180 (includes supplies, custom t-shirt, and Science Olympiad registration)**

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Writing the Research Paper (Gr. 7-9)- In this class, students will learn the process of writing a book report/critique and a formal research paper. They will follow a step-by-step approach to research—from developing a topic and gathering sources to outlining, drafting, revising, and creating a works cited page. Along the way, students will strengthen their organization and analytical skills. **Class Cost = \$50 (\$45 + \$5 supplies)**

Meteorology (30 wks) (Gr. 8-12)- You'll learn the difference between climate & weather, what air masses, fronts, high & low pressure areas are, what the jet stream is, cloud type identification, and how all of these combine to create our weather. We will focus on the formation & path of storms and the weather that attends them. You'll begin to learn how to forecast and there will be a forecasting competition. **Class cost = \$150**

A Christian's Guide to Philosophy (Gr. 9-12)- This course walks through the major philosophical disciplines of Western thought. High-school students, working within a Biblical worldview, will engage with several philosophers and their works. These students will emerge better equipped to approach a college-level philosophy course. **Cost: \$50 (\$40 plus \$10 textbook)**

Your Yearbook (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)- Students will be guided through the process of making a yearbook for the co-op. They will receive instruction and guidance in areas of planning, photography, writing, and graphic organization as they compile all the components to complete the project. Some activities may take place outside of the classroom/class hours, and

students will be expected to take initiative to contribute and accomplish tasks. All co-op families will be able to individually go online to order/purchase their own copy of the yearbook through the online service utilized.

Cost of class is \$100.

Geometry (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)- Prerequisite: Algebra I. This course is taught based on MathUSee Geometry and is a high school course. This is meant to supplement your student's Geometry education that is already taking place in the home. This will be done by checking for understanding, mini lessons and reinforcement of concepts through song and other interactive means while also developing good problem solving skills. Students will be required to actively watch 1 video lesson per chapter, complete worksheets & tests outside of class. **Required Material: MathUSee - [Geometry Student Workbook and Tests \(\\$48\)](#) Student Workbook ISBN: 978-1-60826-342-4 Test Booklet ISBN: 978-1-60826-348-6 & [Geometry DVD's \(\\$52\)](#) ISBN 978-1-60826-038-6. You will also need a protractor and compass. Please purchase these items prior to class.**

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Church History From 33 AD-1517- (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)- "I will build My Church and the gates of hell will not prevail against it." These words of Jesus affix importance to the Church and its place in history. This class will trace the purpose of the Sovereign God who builds His Church through the ages despite its challenges and persecution from within and without. We will begin our journey with a mini-study of Acts 1-13 in order to set the foundation for the origin of the Church. We'll read about and discuss apostolic and early Church leaders, the rise of the Church in Rome, the Dark Ages and Medieval Era, and end our investigation with the Reformation. Because God is the God of all history, as we study the Church, we'll also be including relevant cultural and geographic information as well as pertinent world events and figures.

Along with our Bibles, our primary source will be the text *The Church in history* by B.K. Kuiper: \$31.99 **Cost \$200.00**

Apologia Chemistry Lab (2 hr. 30 wk)(Gr. 9-12)-This two-hour lab class accompanies the Apologia "Exploring Creation with Chemistry" (3rd edition) curriculum. Class time will be used to complete all the laboratory exercises, to reinforce and supplement the concepts of the text and to review practice problems. A course grade will be given. **Course Prerequisite:** successful completion of Algebra 1

Munchkin Gym (Gr. PreK-K)- We will play games and do exercises that promote growth in both

fine and large motor skills. Students will be expected to follow instructions.

Class cost \$30.00

Fundamentals of Music (Gr. K-2)- Our weekly themed lessons will build on the repertoire, singing games, and concepts covered in the spring class. Students who took the class previously are welcome to take it again as it will be new content each semester. The themes will be centered around the autumn season and pets. Areas of focus: steady beat, movement, vocal exploration, singing alone and with others, long/short, high/low, fast/slow, loud/soft, and reading and notating quarter and eighth note rhythms. Additional areas of exposure: rhythming words, cross-body movement/clapping, pattern recognition, ASL (American Sign Language) letters and colors, literature (children's books to fit the themes), and classical music. There will also be an opportunity for each child to get a "recital ticket." This is a bit like musical "show and tell." Students can either perform by singing or playing an instrument for the class or they can bring in an instrument from home to show the class (toy/handmade instruments are fine!). This is not required and is very casual. The purposes are to encourage interest in music at home and to give the students an opportunity to talk/sing/perform in front of their classmates. The last class will include a short performance for anyone who would like to attend. **Cost: \$50**

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Making Math Memorable (Gr. K-2)- Math can actually be FUN! This class will focus on making math memorable and fun through a variety of engaging hands-on activities which will include manipulatives, STEM projects, learning games, and math-centered literature. Support will be given for the memorization of basic addition/subtraction facts. Number sense, critical thinking, and core math concepts for this level will be reinforced, math will be related to real life, and most of all, much FUN will be had!

Class cost: \$50 (\$35 + \$15 materials fee)

Days of Creation Art Theory (Gr. K-2)- Students will be introduced to art theory concepts and complete fun projects based on the six days of creation. Subjects covered will include color theory, texture, line, perspective, basic shapes and value. **Class Fee: \$65 (\$50 + \$15 material fee)**

Tails From History (Gr. 3-5)- Travel through history as we learn about a different animal hero each week. We will learn about the animal species, as well as what made each hero famous. We will learn about US history, animals in flight, animals in war and more. **Class cost: \$40**

Apologia Science- Land Animals of the Sixth Day (20 wks)(Gr. 3-5)- We will study Apologia's Land Animals curriculum this year. Students will explore the animals God created on the 6th day of creation: worms, dinosaurs, lions, horses...and everything in between! We will do many hands-on activities to reinforce the lessons. Apologia textbook is required for the class. Junior Notebooking Journal is recommended, but not required. **Cost: \$110 (for entire 20 week course and supplies).**

The Sign of the Beaver- Language Arts (Gr. 4-6)- Thirteen year old Matt is learning to survive alone until his family is able to join him. After meeting a native of the land, Matt begins to understand the Beaver clan's way of life and the challenges that the white man brings. This class will be reading the book The Sign of the Beaver to develop language arts skills through class discussions, vocabulary, and comprehension activities. Using graphic organizers, students will develop strategies that include character analysis, summarizing, cause and effect, visualization, inferences and more. Books will be provided for students to use. **Class Fee: \$25**

Art Around the World (Gr. 4-6)- We will make a variety of cultural crafts and art projects from different countries around the world. **Class cost \$45**

Constitution 101 (Gr. 5-adult)- This is a family friendly class, designed to provide a basic understanding of the United States Constitution. We will study the introduction of the US Constitution, learn about a brief history of the Constitution tracing the hand of God, study the breakdown of the First Ten Amendments (The Bill of Rights), and gain a fundamental understanding and how we need to use it today. **Class cost-\$60**

Life Draw I (Gr. 5-12)- Drawing actual objects to learn line, shape, value, color, and perspective. **Pencils available for purchase (usually \$5); not required. Class fee = \$30**

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Critical Thinking and Team Building (Gr. 6-8)-

Each week you will be faced with a problem to solve or a challenge to overcome. Flex your brain and critical thinking skills as you work with your peers to overcome the challenge. You'll learn more about your personality type, leadership, communication and teamwork skills, and how to work well with multiple personalities, strengths and weaknesses. Challenges will include an escape room, solving a crime, building a bridge with spaghetti, and more! **Class Cost: \$50**

Putting the Why In Poetry (Gr. 6-9)- Rhyme and rhythm, meter and metaphor – what's the point? Join us as we explore poetry, its purpose, and its elements, with a focus on identifying poetic devices in context. Watch our "poet-tree" grow as we add poetic elements, devices, and poets each week. This class is for poetry enthusiasts and skeptics alike! **Class Cost = \$40**

Macsa Bible Quizzing (Gr. 6-12)- We will learn the rules, types of questions, and specifics of Macsa Bible Quizzing. Most of all, we will have fun quizzing on the Word of God. This is for "just interested" and "serious" quizzers. The passage this year is John 13-21(KJV). HOWEVER, we will be quizzing only on John 13-17 for the fall semester. We will begin week one quizzing on John 13 and add more of the passage each week. I will get the passage material and schedule to you when you sign up for the class, so you can begin memorizing during the summer. There is an option to join a team for three quiz a thons and a retreat in January - March of 2026, but this is NOT required. This is a great way to memorize the Word of God and have fun quizzing too. **Cost- \$8.00 for the quiz**

Gym Games (Gr. 6-12)- An active gym class featuring large group games that provide a good cardio workout. **(\$10 discount for each additional sibling) Class fee = \$30**

The History of Christian Civilization- Part 1(20 wks)(Gr. 6-12)- This class will communicate to the student that "Every good and perfect gift" is truly from above. Apart from the advent of Christ, our world would be radically different, and would look, perhaps even to borrow a well known quote from Thomas Hobbes, "No arts; no letters; no society; and which is worst of all, continual fear, and danger of violent death; and the life of man, solitary, poor, nasty, brutish, and short." A few of the objectives are: 1) To have students have a thorough knowledge of the text. 2) To have them understand that all civilization has roots in Christianity. 3) To develop their worldview filter in terms of Biblical revelation. **Class Cost= \$70+book purchase**

Introduction to 3D Art- Paper, Wood, and Clay Sculpture- (30 wks)(Gr. 6-adult)- Students will create a wide variety of studio work in several different types of Sculpture, Functional and Non-functional Ceramics, with both "additive and deductive approaches." We will work with paper, cardboard, Paris craft, Clay, and other media. We will also gain exposure to many masters of this art form, however, much time will be devoted to learning and developing impressive skills. **Tuition and Supplies- \$295**

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Chess (Gr. 7-12)- If you enjoy playing Chess, bring your chess board (if you have one) and come play with your friends at Co-op! The focus of this class is mainly for game time, not teaching. However, I will have a book by Usborne, "Starting Chess," for those who need some extra help. We will need to have enough chess boards in order for all students to play, so please plan on bringing yours to co-op each week. **Cost- \$5**

CPR/ First Aid (Gr. 7-12)- American Heart Association heartsaver CPR and first aid certification course. Students will complete hands-on CPR training and basic first aid skills. Upon successful completion of the class, students will receive the heartsaver CPR/first aid certification from AHA. Younger students must be able to perform a successful chest compression in order to become certified. Preference given to students but adults are welcome if class size permits. If you want to learn CPR and first aid skills but do not want a certification from AHA, you can join the class for a reduced fee. **Class cost is \$50 which includes everything necessary for the class and certification. Without AHA certification the class cost is \$30.**

To the Word: A Prelude to Biblical Hermeneutics (Gr. 9-12)- This course equips students with the basic tools for inductive Bible study. The approach a reader takes in the reading of Scripture must be careful and intentional. Students will be able to delve into a passage's meaning for ancient audiences and its implications for today. This class will provide an environment designed to cultivate growth in the knowledge and understanding of who God is and who we are in light of His sovereign plan.

Apologia Biology Labs (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)- This lab class accompanies the Apologia "Exploring Creation with Biology" (3rd edition) curriculum, and includes the study of bacteria, protists, fungi, plants and animals. Class time will be used to complete all the laboratory exercises and reinforce the concepts of the text. Includes homework and quizzes. A course grade will be provided. **Cost: \$170 (textbook rental available for additional \$20)**

Pre Engineering- Electronics (30 wks)(10-12)- **Prerequisite for this course**- Pre-Engineering Electricity with the exception of seniors who are taking or have taken Chemistry or Physics. Students will learn how diodes and transistors work and how they function in power supplies, amplifiers, op amps, flip flops, 555 timers, logic gates and project circuits like Tesla Coils, strobe lights, clap switches, subwoofer and phone booster amps, bi-amped audio power amplifiers and preamps. Students may build a wide variety of projects though project work is not required. **Class cost = \$150**

Writing the Research Paper (Gr. 10-12)- This course covers how to write a critique and a formal research paper. Lessons follow a step-by-step approach using MLA format—from developing a topic and conducting research to organizing ideas and citing sources. While not limited to students pursuing higher education, this course equips them with strong writing and critical thinking skills that will help prepare them for college-level work. **Class Cost = \$50 (\$45 + \$5)**

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12:00 - 1:00-

Beginner Language Arts (Gr. PreK-1)- This class will use children's literature to identify story elements such as character, setting, plot, etc. Students will then respond to the story by completing a simple writing prompt. Games and activities practicing letter sound identification, decoding and blending simple words, and sight words will also be included in the class. **Class cost = \$25**

Elementary Gym (Gr. K-5)- An active gym class featuring large group games that provide a good cardio workout. (\$10 discount for each additional sibling) **Class fee = \$30**

Junior Worship Dance (Gr. 2-4)- Dancers will explore new movements in this class and learn how to use dance to worship Jesus. This class will be filled with fun worship exercises to grow in faith and learn basic dance technique. Everyone in the class will have the chance to perform in a worship dance piece for friends and family on the last day of co-op. **Cost- \$30**

The Mouse and the Motorcycle: Loving Lit Through Lapbooks (Gr. 3-5)- We will read the classic children's novel, The Mouse and the Motorcycle by Beverly Cleary, each week completing a creative hands-on activity or two that corresponds to the book. Many of these pieces will be compiled into a lapbook, which will be a special keepsake documenting the students' learning and serving as a memento of our novel study. Reading comprehension, vocabulary, writing skills, and character analysis will all be incorporated into our time together. Please purchase a copy of The Mouse and the Motorcycle and bring it to the first class. **Tuition: \$55 (\$35 + \$20 materials fee)**

Game Time (Gr. 3-6)- Team Games and Challenges! This class will include a mix of team challenges, relays, board games, lego challenges, and minute-to-win-it games. Build knowledge, coordination, strategy & teamwork skills in a fun way! **Class Fee = \$35**

Miniature Figure Painting (Gr. 5-12)- Learn how to paint miniature figurines using techniques like base color, dry brushing and wet mixing. Painting on a small scale is a different challenge from other types of painting and improves fine motor skills. Students will need to bring their own miniature figurines. (These can be from board games that they have, ones they have 3D printed or figurines that are just for display. If help is needed on where to find these figurines, please reach out.) Students will also need to bring their own brushes. Paints and palettes will be provided. **Cost: \$45**

Life Draw II (Gr. 5-12)- Continuing development of drawing skills and techniques. Prerequisite of Life Draw 1 or teacher discretion. **Class fee = \$35 (\$30 + \$5.00 supplies)**

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Beginner Flute (Gr. 5-12)- This beginner flute class will cover the basics of playing the flute. Students will learn the parts of the flute, assembly and care of the instrument, proper breathing and embouchure (mouth position), music theory basics, fingerings for notes, and playing basic, simple melodies. Each student will need to bring their own instrument, in good working condition, and his/her lesson book to class each week. If you need info on obtaining a flute please feel free to contact me. There are rental programs available that are helpful if you do not have an instrument or would rather not purchase right away. **Cost- \$80 (\$60 + \$20 materials fee-lesson book)**

Cooking For Life (Gr. 6-8)- Food is meant to taste good as well as BE good. In this class, we will explore the health benefits (or lack thereof) in commonly eaten foods, learn how to make healthy food choices in the kitchen, and have some fun creating nutritious snacks! Weekly supplies will be required (i.e. spatulas, bowls, etc), though all food items will be provided. **Cost: \$85**

STEM Investigations (Gr. 6-8)- In this class, students will do hands-on learning and investigation on topics such as bridges, buildings, and simple machines. Teamwork is a requirement as students will be working together often to observe, plan, build, and possibly do it all over again! **Cost of class and materials is \$40.**

Comic Illustration & the Art of Portraiture (30 wks)(Gr. 6-12)- This new studio class provides students with the basics of Comic Illustration and The Art of Portraiture. Students will gain an introduction to basic human proportions,

anatomy, creative problem solving and illustration techniques. Assignments will form a basis to critically understand these art forms and the appreciation of a good sense of humor. **Class Cost: \$240 (\$195 + \$45 materials) + Student Purchased materials (3-inch 3 Ring Binder, Page Protectors, Sketchbook, 12 or more colored pencils, #2 Pencils, miscellaneous as needed)**

Choirchime Ensemble (Gr. 6-12)- This is the ultimate "team sport" in the music world, choirchimes are very similar to handbells and played in the same way. Each participant will be responsible to play 1 or two (or more!) chimes throughout each piece. There are no prerequisites; students will be taught how to read music. The semester will culminate with a performance during the last class and possibly an additional Christmas performance in December at Glick's Greenhouse. **Cost- \$75**

eBay For Beginners: Launch Your Own Online Sales Journey (Gr. 8-12)- Ready to turn clutter into cash? In this hands-on class, students will learn the ins and outs of selling on eBay—from setting up an account and snapping great product photos to writing eye-catching listings and shipping like a pro. We'll cover how to spot valuable items, price them right, and understand eBay's rules and buyer psychology. Whether you're looking to start a side hustle or just want to make extra money selling things you no longer need, this course gives you the skills to launch your own eBay business confidently and responsibly. No business experience needed—just bring your curiosity and a willingness to learn! **Class cost: \$50**

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Critical Thinking and Team Building (Gr. 9-12)-

Each week you will be faced with a problem to solve or a challenge to overcome. Flex your brain and critical thinking skills as you get to know and learn to work with your peers to overcome the challenge. You'll learn more about your personality type, leadership, communication and teamwork skills, and how to work well with multiple personalities, strengths and weaknesses. Challenges will include an escape room, solving a crime, strategy games, problem solving races, hidden role games and more! **Class Cost: \$50**

Environmental AgriScience (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)-

This 1-credit high science class will focus on topics such as forestry, soil science, wildlife management, agriculture, water quality, air quality, energy use and more. Daily homework will be provided and class time will include related activities. A final course grade will be provided. **Cost: \$150**

C.S. Lewis Classic Literature (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)-

C.S. Lewis is a master of Medieval literature, an accomplished author, and a converted atheist who became an articulate apologist for the gospel of Jesus Christ. This 30 week course will examine two of Lewis's short novels: *The Screwtape Letters* and *The Great Divorce*; we will also investigate his commentary on forgiveness and faith from his book *The Weight of Glory*. **Cost: \$200**

Internship Seminar (Gr. 10-12)-

Students will be guided through the process of discussion to consider possible career choices and how to professionally connect to someone for employment. Under guidance, they will be required to call or email and arrange the details

of an internship/shadowing so that they experience first hand what a job in a given field might be like. Whether considering no further education after high school, a trade school, or a college of their choice, this class is to help students briefly experience a possible career choice to become further prepared for their future. **Cost of class is \$50.**

Algebra II (30 wks)(Gr. 10-12)- Prerequisite:

Algebra 1. This course is taught based on MathUSee Algebra 2. This class is meant to supplement your student's Algebra 2 education that is already taking place in the home. This will be done by checking for understanding, mini lessons and reinforcement of concepts through song and other interactive means while also developing good problem solving skills. This two hour lab class accompanies the Apologia Exploring Creation with Physics (2nd edition) curriculum. Class will be used to complete all the lab exercises, to reinforce and supplement the concepts of the text and to review practice problems. Includes homework, quizzes and tests. A grade will be provided. **Cost = \$210 (\$190 + \$20 book)**

Coffee With Pastor Joel (Gr. 10-12)- Pastor Saint shepherds the Independence Reformed Bible Church. Conversation will be allocated according to students interest/questions. **Cost-\$20**

All About Art (Gr. 3-4)- Students will have an opportunity to express their creativity while learning a variety of art concepts and media skills. Subjects covered will include color theory, texture, line, perspective, basic shapes, value, art vocabulary and related art history. Projects will include oil pastel, drawing, painting, mixed media, and more. **Cost:\$80 (\$50 + \$30 material fee)**

Recorder Karate (Gr. 3-6)- Recorder Karate is a series of sequential songs starting with "Hot Cross Buns" and ending with "Ode to Joy." Each week students will learn the concepts needed to perform the next song, spend time practicing, and "test" (play the song for me) either individually or in small groups. Students earn a "belt" (piece of colored yarn tied around the bottom of their recorder) each time they master a song. Students can also earn beads by learning songs outside of the Recorder Karate program. I will provide online resources for them to

practice at home (highly recommended). We will perform at a mini-concert on the last day of TEACH. **Cost- \$60**

Basic Grammar and Writing (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)-

The basics of the English language are necessary for fluent and well structured oral and written expression. As we address the basics of grammar (parts of speech, sentence structure, punctuation, etc.), we will apply what we are learning to our writing and speaking. Lots of whole group interaction! Students should buy the grammar text: Sadlier Grammar for Writing level 11 (green book) and bring a notebook or laptop for taking notes. History and Basis of Civil Law (20 wks)(Gr.

9-12)- Why do we have law? Isn't law, by its very nature, coercive? Don't we wish to let people do whatever they want to do? Finally, isn't law restrictive? That is, doesn't law, by its very nature restrict the freedom of some for the benefit of others? Psalm 119 tells us that God's Law is a wonderful thing. Without it, we would lack wisdom, and without wisdom, knowledge becomes the problem, not the solution. In this class we will explore the history of law, but, more importantly, the *basis* of law, and why our Benevolent Creator blessed us with His Law, and the problems we would have without it. Some questions addressed: 1) Are all law codes equal? 2) Is all law moral? 3) What makes any law moral? Or, immoral? 4) Where can law be found? 5) Are human beings capable of deciding

between moral and immoral? 6) Can morality be legislated? 7) How can one love God and neighbor without law? **Cost: \$20**

Immersion Spanish (30 wks)(9-12)-

I will be using a combination literature and grammar study to teach language in a way that is incredibly robust and comprehensive. Books to used while in class will be *The Tree is Older Than You Are:...* by Naomi Shihab Nye, *The Harvest Birds* by Blanca Lopez de Mariscal and *A Brief Spanish Grammar Lessons* by M.A. DeVitis. **Class cost: \$200.00**

Financial Peace Universal Foundations in Personal Finance (30 wks)(Gr. 9-12)-

Dave Ramsey's "Foundation in Personal Finance" course aims to teach students how to manage money and build wealth, covering topics like debt, investments, giving, taxes and budgeting. The course emphasizes debt elimination, emergency fund creation, retirement savings, and charitable giving. It also teaches practical skills like budgeting and saving for large purchases like cars. This class is taught by Mike Bailey, who is a certified Dave Ramsey Coordinator. **Cost is = \$120 total (\$60 for textbook, license and supplies + \$60 for class)**
