Class Fee: \$5

Credits Earned: 1 credit

Class Description: This is a basic Computer, email, and Google Docs class. It is meant to help students learn how to use some basic, common tools that will be helpful in life, school, and work. Nearly all jobs require some type of computer skill including: time cards, spreadsheets, reports, emails, file sharing, etc. Google Docs has similar formatting to Microsoft Word, Excel, and Powerpoint called Docs, Sheets, and Slides so a student will be able to transition to those formats as many colleges and some employers require that platform. Docs is a program that you will be able to use to create essays, school papers, letters, resumes, proposals, etc. Slides is a program that allows you to create dynamic presentations and slideshows. Sheets is a program where you can enter data and create formulas that use the data in the way that you need. For instance, you may simply create a phone list and organize the phone numbers according to the area code. Another way to use Sheets is to keep track of your income, calculate totals, subtract expenses, and tell of that data to make a chart of where all of your money went. In addition to these programs, you will learn some other basic computer skills like: using email, good file storage practices, file sharing, and Google Classroom.

Chemistry- Labs and Supplement

Full Year, Period 1, Grade 10-12

Maximum Students: 12

Class Fee: \$30 (to include provision of student worktext and whole-group lab supplies; if a large amount is left

over reimbursements may be allotted)

Credits Earned: 1 credit

Class Description: This co-op course is designed to facilitate your homeschooler through a course of high school chemistry. Co-op class time will focus on labs and checking understanding of the lessons completed by students throughout the week. Publisher description- This laboratory-based high school chemistry course is the first chemistry course a college bound student should take. It gives the student an introduction to the basic laws and theories of modern chemistry and the skills used to analyze a wide range of chemical processes.

Homework: Students should expect to spend an hour or more of time on the class each day. The course is 36 weeks (180 days) long, so work will need to be done before co-op begins and after it ends to complete it.

Required Curriculum: Discovering Design with Chemistry by Dr. Jay L. Wile (\$59 on Christianbook.com), Answer Key and Tests (\$10 on Christianbook.com), and Discovering Design with Chemistry Lab Kit (\$68.79 on Christianbook.com; siblings may share)

Communication and Speech I

Suanna Myers Fall Semester, Period 2, Grade 9-12 Maximum Students: 12

Class Fee: \$5.00

Credits Earned: 1/2 English Credit

Class Description: Why Communication and Speech? Many students fear speaking in front of a class or other groups. Some may even be shy when speaking in front of smaller family gatherings. Whether gung-ho or timid, this class will give students various tools, practice, and experience as they learn about the different types of communication and public speaking. The purpose of this class is to be able to speak clearly, effectively, and confidently; no matter who the audience is. Topics covered will include understanding the audience, content, organization, visual aides, speaker appearance, poise, voice, passion, eye contact, gestures, speed, different types of communication, and different types of speeches. Projects will include children's literature, Bible stories, poetry, humorous monologues, using visual aids in speeches, researching and presenting biographical reports, elevator pitches, sales pitches, infomercials, interviews, dealing with customer service reps, speaking in front of peers (often the 'scariest" audience"!), and evaluating speeches. Depending on the number of students registered (and/or co-op cancellations), projects and speeches may be scheduled to be done via recordings, Zoom, or arranged times outside of co-op.

<u>Note</u>: This is a serious highschool level class and all work is <u>expected</u> to be done each week. However, the students will have fun and the moments of "speaking in front of others" will be well prepared for. By the end of the semester, students will gain confidence and poise! Students will also be more prepared for speaking assignments in future classes, including college level courses. Plus, we will have fun in this class!

Homework: Weekly student book assignments, additional exercises/worksheets from the teacher, plus research and preparation work based on upcoming projects and speeches. Links will be sent as needed for on-line resources and videos to be watched and/or listened to outside of class.

Maximum Students: 12

Class Fee: \$5.00

Credits Earned: 1/2 Elective Credit

Class Description: This class follows the Communication and Speech I class.

Although there will be times of "public" speaking, "formal" debate is not the main focus of this class (though it is covered). The goal is to help students learn how to strengthen and balance their opinions, assessments, and points of views with logic and supporting evidence. They will learn how to present their conclusions in a way that is understood no matter who they are communicating with: friends, family, peers, co-workers, employers, customers, the public-at-large, etc. This class promotes arguing, but in the classic sense, "to provide rational reasons for or against an idea or action". Bolder students will learn to be more controlled and informed when discussing their ideas and opinions. Timid students will learn to be more assured and confident when communicating with others. Every student will learn how to reason, argue and debate. Depending on the number of students registered (and/or co-op cancellations), projects and debates may be scheduled to be done via recordings, Zoom, or arranged times outside of co-op.

<u>Note</u>: This is a serious highschool level class and all work is <u>expected</u> to be done each week. However, it will also be a fun class!

Homework: Weekly workbook reading of approximately 25 pages (+/-), workbook exercises, some additional exercises/worksheets from the teacher, plus research and preparation work based on upcoming projects and debates. Class Description: This is a basic Computer, email, and Google Docs class. It is meant to help students learn how to use some basic, common tools that will be helpful in life, school, and work. Nearly all jobs require some type of computer skill including: time cards, spreadsheets, reports, emails, file sharing, etc. Google Docs has similar formatting to Microsoft Word, Excel, and Powerpoint called Docs, Sheets, and Slides. So a student will be able to transition to those formats as many colleges and some employers require that platform. Docs is a program that you will be able to use to create essays, school papers, letters, resumes, proposals, etc. Slides is a program that allows you to create dynamic presentations and slide shows. Sheets is a program where you can enter data and create formulas that use the data in the way that you need. For instance, you may simply create a phone list and organize the phone numbers according to the area code. Another way to use Sheets is to keep track of your income, calculate totals, subtract expenses, and tell of that data to make a chart of where all of your money went.
