

GRACE Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct is a general list of rules and regulations for group events. Some of these may not be applicable at all events. However, additions and/or adjustments may be made when necessary.

- Parents are responsible for their own children at all times.
- Children are expected to behave appropriately for any given situation (using indoor voices indoors, running outside, listening attentively to a speaker, etc.)
- If a child's behavior is unacceptable, he/she may be asked to stop by another parent. Accordingly, if a parent observes another child's unacceptable behavior, that parent may ask the child to stop or may bring the child to his/her own parents. Ultimately, however, each child is his own parent's responsibility.
- All children and adults are expected to treat each other with kindness and respect
- All members are expected to RSVP to events they plan to attend, and to notify the event planner if they cannot follow through.
- All members are expected to respect the arrival and start times of all activities.
- All members shall refrain from gossip or any comments that may negatively influence how a third party may view another member. This includes adults and children.

I agree that my child is expected to abide by all rules and regulations as outlined in the Code of Conduct. I agree that if my child fails to abide by this code or engages in any infraction that is deemed by the coordinator to be inappropriate, he/she may be dismissed from this activity and sent home at my expense with no right to reimbursement.

As a child participant, I have read the above or it has been read and explained to me and I understand the Code of Conduct for our group and will abide by it.

As an adult participant, I understand that if my behavior is not in keeping with the above Code, I may be asked to leave the event.
