Age/grade: K4 – 2nd grade

Cost: Supply fee \$40; Class fee \$218.75

Description: We'll go on an adventure of learning about various animals. We will learn about their classifications, characteristics, diet, and habitat. We will learn about the animals through crafts, worksheets, games, and play.

ASL 1

Age/grade: 8th – 12th grade

Cost: Supply fee \$30; Class fee \$281.25

Description: This class is designed to provide the student with a knowledge and understanding of American Sign Language (ASL), with an emphasis on fingerspelling, sentence structure, grammar, vocabulary, facial expressions, and awareness of the Deaf population. There will be homework, in class group projects, tests, and involvement with Deaf community. They are required to practice sign language at home. Students are encouraged to attend events where ASL is used and for them to mingle and communicate with Deaf people and other students of ASL. There will be no voice in the classroom.

Parents will be required to supply: 3 ring binder 1 inch, loose-leaf papers and pencils or pens, as well as the book Master ASL! Level One and Master ASL! Fingerspelling, Numbers, and Glossing by Jason E. Zinza. Order from www.signmedia.com and get Master ASL! Description: This class will be using the Mr. Q's curriculum. Mr.Q's chemistry course is a 36 week course which we will condense into 25 weeks. It is a high school level course designed to prepare students to master chemistry principles and concepts. This class is the Lab portion of the overall grade. All reading and worksheets will be done at home. Students will need the textbook (co-op pricing available if we buy in bulk). The majority of the labs will be done in the kitchen using food.

However, families who are interested in adapting it toward credit eligibility are encouraged to speak with the instructor directly to explore possible requirements, such as additional assignments, assessments, or documentation, to better align the course with credit-earning standards.

Hands-on Art History

Age/grade: 6th – 12th grade

Cost: Supply fee \$0; Class fee \$218.75

Description: In this class students will create a notebook with a concentration on a new artist each week. They will not only learn about the history behind famous artworks but replicate the style with their own art using different mediums. At the end of the year they will have a beautiful Sketchbook filled with their own art along with fun notes and photos of the artists and pieces that inspired them. All supplies are included in the cost of the class so you don't have to worry about a supply list and all they need to bring to class is their notebook.

High School English

Teacher: Gina Smith

Age/grade: 8th – 12th grade

Cost: Supply fee \$65; Class fee \$300

Description: This High School English class is open to students in 8th-12th grade and is designed as a flexible, mixed-grade high school English experience that develops strong reading, writing, and communication skills in a supportive environment. Students engage with a variety of literary genres, including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama, while learning to think critically, analyze text, and express ideas clearly and effectively. Emphasis is placed on thoughtful discussion and writing for multiple purposes, including narrative, analytical, and argumentative compositions.

This is a full, credit-earning English class, and a grade will be provided. Instruction will be differentiated to meet students where they are academically while still maintaining shared learning goals.

As part of this class, students will need to have access to Google Classroom at home. Some assignments will be completed via Google Classroom, and grading will be tracked there as well.

Intro to Math

Age/grade: K4 – 2nd grade

Cost: Supply fee \$30; Class fee \$218.75

Description: We will work on basic math concepts such as number recognition, counting, shapes/patterns and simple addition and subtraction. We will use manipulatives, games and worksheets throughout the class.

Intro to Spanish

Teacher: Lisset Clark

Age/grade: 11 y/o – 15 y/o

Cost: Supply fee \$15; Class fee \$281.25

Description: We will be following a middle/high school (homeschool) curriculum: "Skills For Success" by Carson Dellosa, Spanish workbook. Covered topics include: common expressions; cardinal and ordinal numbers; nouns, pronouns, and adjectives; gender and number agreement; conjugating verbs; basic sentence structure; making comparisons; asking questions; telling time, location/direction words.

Learning with Legos

Through engaging literature, creative and academic writing, vocabulary development, grammar instruction, and class discussions, students will strengthen essential language arts skills while learning to think critically and express themselves clearly. The course encourages curiosity, collaboration, and creativity as students explore a variety of texts, genres, and themes appropriate for middle school learners. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension, written communication, speaking and listening skills, and building confidence in independent learning.

Individual assignments will be graded and returned, however, it will be up to the parent to keep track of grades and formulate an overall grade based on their own weighting preferences, if desired. Instructor will, however, provide feedback that can be used in your semi-annual progress reports.

Paleontology

Teacher: Marisa Bishop

Age/grade: 1st – 5th grade

Cost: Supply fee \$40; Class fee \$225

Description: In this course, we will learn about many different types of dinosaurs, including land-dwelling, flying, and sea reptiles. We cover what they looked like, what they ate, where they lived, and why they died. The curriculum utilizes several books that examine dinosaurs from various perspectives, all based on a biblical stance.

Parents will need to supply the following materials: Binder, colored pencils, pencil and eraser, glue sticks

Preschool Skills

Teacher: Gina Smith

Age/grade: 3 y/o – 6 y/o

Cost: Supply fee \$30; Class fee \$225

Description: This preschool skills class is designed to introduce young learners to foundational academic and classroom skills through hands-on activities, play-based learning, music, movement, stories, and crafts. Students will practice early literacy and math concepts such as letters, sounds, numbers, colors, shapes, patterns, and fine motor skills while also building important social skills like listening, sharing, following directions, and participating in group activities. The class provides a fun, encouraging environment where children can grow in confidence, curiosity, and readiness for future learning.

This class is a drop-off class, but parents can stay if they prefer, as long as they have a background check completed within the last two years on file, and do not have unregistered children (outside of the class's age range) accompanying them. If you would like to stay, please register for the class, and the instructor will follow-up regarding the necessary background check.

Children must be potty-trained and able to use the bathroom without assistance, unless a parent will be accompanying them for the class.

STEM

Teacher: Stacie Ashworth

Age/grade: 2nd – 7th grade

Cost: Supply fee \$50; Class fee \$218.75

Description: STEM is a fun hands-on experiment class that explores Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. Students will explore how these core concepts interact together in everyday life through individual, group, and class projects! Students will use the engineering design process to test and improve their designs to reach a final project that is effective!

Threads of Faith (learn to crochet)

Age/grade: 8 y/o – 15 y/o

Cost: Supply fee \$10; Class fee \$250

Description: We will start with learning the names and working with basic stitches as we make our way into creating a “swatch”. Once these basic skills are grasped, we can move on to creating cup coasters, small, square napkins, etc. as we learn how to read and follow patterns. I will provide materials each class and I'll also give each student a goody bag with crochet tools for them to keep. (for safety purposes I will not add items like scissors or needles inside these bags) but they will be used wisely during our class.

Tuttle Twins American History

Cost: Supply fee \$40; Class fee \$225

Description: America's History Volume 1 covers these events and more!

- The origins of freedom and limited government, from the Magna Carta to Enlightenment ideas
- Exploration, colonization, and the foundations of early American society

- The causes and key events of the American Revolution
- The Revolutionary War, major turning points, and the path to independence
- The creation of the Constitution and the Bill of Rights

We will have several activities and crafts to reinforce the lessons we learn.
