Literary Analysis

- Write complete, clear sentences (no fragments or run-ons). Ability to combine simple sentences into complex expressions using a variety of sentence openers. Recognize an independent clause, dependent clause, run on sentence and comma splice.
- Recognize and use parts of speech (noun, verb, pronoun, adjective, adverb, preposition)
- Use subjective and objective pronouns properly. Use pronouns to determine point of view. Maintain consistent past or present verb tense and subject -verb agreement.
- Use correct punctuation (commas, quotation marks, apostrophes, end punctuation) Use italics and quotation marks correctly in titles.
- Apply correct capitalization (proper nouns)
- Use a thesaurus to broaden vocabulary. Spell grade-level words correctly.

- Write an organized paragraph with an effective topic sentence, relevant supporting details, and an effective summary sentence; indentation and paragraph breaks. Recognize and use transition words.
- Write a simple essay with introduction, body paragraphs, and conclusion. Construct a thesis statement that controls the essay. Evaluate and respond to a prompt. Properly cite text evidence to support ideas.
- Use MLA format to construct a proper heading
- Revise and edit writing for clarity and correctness. Include all assigned requirements from a checklist.
- Read and comprehend grade-level texts independently. Make inferences from text. Distinguish between fact and opinion.
- Follow written and verbal directions. Organize assignments so they may be completed on time.
- Understand what plagiarism is and why it matters.
