High School Writing Course: Creative Writing

In this 18-week course, students will discover, develop and experiment with their personal writing voices. Together we will explore the fascinating world of fiction, poetry, drama, nonfiction and memoir. I will nurture your child's writing voice, encourage them to take risks in their writing, and cultivate authenticity through the written word. Students will work at home on weekly writing assignments, journal, work in peer groups and produce a portfolio of creative writing to cherish. I will encourage their thoughts and ideas to come forth in a safe environment. We will all become braver writers.

High School Writing Course: Essay Writing

In this 18-week course, students will learn the basics of writing a five-paragraph essay. I will review writing mechanics throughout the course and give students in-class writing opportunities. Students will begin each class with a free-writing journal topic to get their creative mind flowing. We will brainstorm to help them find topics that matter to them. We will focus on developing their personal writing voices. They will put their knowledge to work by writing formulaic compositions at home each week. I will assign some Kahn Academy YouTube videos to help them with common writing struggles and mechanics. Some of the types of essays we will explore include persuasive, descriptive, narrative, expository, argumentative, and analytical. We will round off our writing journey in the spring semester with a full-blown MLA formatted research paper. I am confident their confidence will thrive in such immersion.

Art History: Middle School Course

In this 18-week course, students will learn about some of the main characters in art history and get to know each artist's visual voices. We will explore ancient art with the Egyptians, the medieval period with Giotto and the Renaissance with Michelangelo, Da Vinci, Botticelli and Raphael. Then we'll move on to the baroque period with Rembrandt, Vermeer, Gainsborough and Rubens. We'll end in the modern period with Monet, Van Gogh, Cassatt, Turner and Whistler. Students will engage in some hands-on art by dabbling in some of the methods of the masters. Afterall, what is art without getting our hands a little messy?

Art History: High School Course

In this 18-week art survey course, students will learn about some of the main characters in art history and get to know each artist's visual voices. Students will present the information to the class in a presentation. This is going to be a lot of fun.
