

Cornerstone Family Schools Conduct Policy

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PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to define conduct expected by member families of Cornerstone Family Schools (CFS) at CFS activities.

SCRIPTURAL BASIS

And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him. Colossians 3:17

When a man's ways please the Lord, he makes even his enemies to be at peace with him. Proverbs 16:7

DEFINITIONS

CFS Activities: Any activity where Cornerstone Family Schools is represented publicly

Program Head: Any CFS Volunteer responsible for coordinating and/or leading a CFS sport or activity

PROCEDURE

As representatives of Cornerstone Family Schools and as ambassadors for Christ, it is necessary that the behavior of the CFS member parents and children demonstrate loyalty to Christ and a servant's heart. It is said that an individual Christian may be the only "Bible" that some nonbelievers ever read. Likewise, misbehavior of professing Christians could be a hindrance to faith for unbelieving observers.

- It is the responsibility of CFS Program Heads to encourage compliance to the conduct guidelines during and after CFS Activities.
- It is the responsibility of CFS member parents to be an example for their children by adhering to this conduct code at CFS Activities.
- Each CFS family is responsible for the conduct of their own members.
- CFS member families understand that abuse of the conduct code could result in suspension or loss of membership as deemed by the CFS Board of Directors

Expected Member Conduct

- Show respect and support for all those in authority, including Program Heads, referees, judges, etc. in action and speech
- No use of foul language
- Always be encouraging with expressions, comments and attitudes toward others
- Pray for opponents during competitions
- Leave facilities that CFS uses in as good or better condition than they were found at arrival
- Promote, encourage and demonstrate Christian fellowship with other schools
- Consistently discourage divisive rivalries
- Promote safety at all times
- Be a spiritual leader
- Assume volunteer duties and responsibilities as opportunities arise
- Resolve matters of dispute or grievance with others at an appropriate place and time and follow the biblical instruction found in Matthew 18:15
- Members should dress in a manner that honors God
- Members will not be in possession of or under the influence of alcohol, cigarettes or illegal drugs
