Required Supplies/Resources:

A notebook or three-ring binder with loose leaf paper

- A student planner with daily, weekly, and monthly calendar sections. The daily section should have a large space section. 8.5 x 11 are often preferable.
- Pens in the colors black, blue, and red
- Pencils with erasers
- Highlighters (thin) in the colors yellow, orange, green, and blue
- Index cards

Course Description: This is a one semester class designed to teach middle school and high school students effective study skills. This is a great way for all students to learn more about study and organizational skills. No background knowledge is required, just a willingness to learn. This Study Skills class guides the student to better understand how they learn and what techniques to use to help them succeed in and out of the classroom. This class has activities that work with the students to develop new habits such as managing their time well, using tools such as daily to-do lists, monthly calendars, assignment sheets, etc. Accountability and responsibility for their schoolwork is strongly stressed and enforced in this class. By the end of the semester, they will have collected many "tools" for their "toolbox" to help them reach their learning goals with greater ease.
