Additional Resources: Tutor will be providing Grammar, Sentence Diagramming, and Vocabulary examples and work online through the class's Microsoft Teams class notebook. Tutor will make copies for handouts as needed.

Class Description: This course is designed to teach children to gather information, sort it and express it in appropriate ways. They will learn how to think and write through a series of persuasive essays. A new skill will be taught each week to help students overcome the three main writing challenges: coming up with ideas, putting your ideas in order, and expressing ideas appropriately. Each essay will be completed in class and at home during a 3–4-week time frame. Additionally, sentence diagramming will be taught to improve sentence structure as a warm-up at the beginning of each class.

Topics Included in Course:

- Write four to six paragraph essays
- Annotate, Summarize, and Outline Fiction and Non-Fiction Reading Selections
- Refute (argue against) or confirm (argue for) parts of stories and vices/virtues shown in those stories.
- Understand comparison and contrast
- Introduce and conclude an essay
- Use narrative to further the purpose of exposition
- Use direct quotes to support an argument
- Deliver writing orally
- Use of grammar and diagramming to develop correct and varied sentence structure in writing
- Develop an expansive vocabulary to better understand reading assignments and to express oneself in academic writing

There is a student-lead reading component to this course. Students will be asked to read 2-4 books of their choosing (with some guidelines) throughout the year to be used with their writing assignments.

- Supplies:
 - Large, 3-ring binder with dividers and loose leaf paper
 - Pens (blue or black AND red ink)
 - Access to a dictionary and thesaurus and computer
