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Background: I have a background in teaching from daycare classes, to public schools in Oklahoma and Missouri and History classes at our homeschool co-op in Springfield MO. I am a mom who is blessed to stay home and homeschool my own three boys.

Class Schedule: This class will meet once a week on Tuesday 3:00-3:50

Class Fees: The total fee for the class is \$320 or \$40 per month from August through April, plus the cost of the textbook and student activities workbook. There is no monthly class fee for December. There is a one-time supply fee of \$15 due at the time of registration. Tuition payments should be made directly to the teacher in person or through PayPal. Tuition can be paid in full, in two semester payments or monthly. Monthly payments are due at the first class of each month. Post dated checks for the entire year will also be accepted.

Supplies Needed in Class: textbook, activities workbook, three ring binder, tab dividers with pockets, ruled paper, pen

Course Description: This is a comprehensive survey of U.S. history over the last two centuries, including the Christian heritage of our country. Students will tour America's history, beginning with the Native Americans and European explorers and wrapping up with present day.

Instructional Methods: reading assignments, activity pages, online discussion boards, literature studies, individual or group projects, and written assignments. YouTube videos will be used within the course. Links to the specific YouTube videos will be provided on Canvas.

Expectations: We only meet for 50 minutes a week, arrive on time to class and be prepared. Stay up to date on all work assigned. Check the course page on Canvas each week. We will be working on study skills as we move through the course work to help students use their time efficiently at home. Students should expect to do 30 minutes a day of work outside of class four days a week. Late assignments will be penalized. If a student is absent from class, it will be their responsibility to contact the teacher for makeup work. Technology will be allowed in the classroom for educational purposes such as notetaking. However, students who become distracted themselves or distract others by texts, calls, apps, or social media will be asked to turn in their devices.
