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Background: I have a background in teaching from daycare classes, to public schools in Oklahoma and Missouri and History classes at our homeschool co-op in Springfield MO. I am a mom who is blessed to stay home and homeschool my own three boys.

Class Schedule: This class will meet once a week on Thursday 1:00-1:50 Spring Semester Only

Class Fees: The total fee for the class is \$160 or \$40 per month from August through November, plus the cost of the textbook and student activities workbook. There is no monthly class fee for December. There is a one-time supply fee of \$10 due at the time of registration. Tuition payments should be made directly to the teacher in person or through PayPal. Tuition can be paid in full, or monthly. Monthly payments are due at the first class of each month. Postdated checks for the entire semester will also be accepted.

Supplies Needed in Class: textbook, activity workbook, three ring binder, tab dividers with pockets, ruled paper, pen

Course Description: In this class students will learn everything from household purchases to the stock market. They will be taught a foundational understanding of economics as a science as well as the economics of countries, businesses, the financial markets and the governments. We will also touch on personal finance as we complete the course including budgeting, banking, debt, credit and interest. This course will be geared towards a higher level and will require diligence in completing homework.

Instructional Methods: reading assignments, activity pages, online discussion boards, literature studies, individual or group projects, and written assignments. YouTube videos will be used within the course. Links to the specific YouTube videos will be provided on Canvas.

Expectations: We only meet for 50 minutes a week, arrive on time to class and be prepared. Stay up to date on all work assigned. Check the course page on Canvas each week. We will be working on study skills as we move through the course work. Students should expect to do 45 minutes a day of work outside of class four days a week. Late assignments will be penalized. If a student is absent from class, it will be their responsibility to contact the teacher for makeup work. Technology will be allowed in the classroom for educational purposes such as notetaking. However, students who become distracted themselves or distract others by texts, calls, apps, or social media will be asked to turn in their devices.
