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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MATH

Algebra I: This course provides a formal development of the algebraic skills and concepts necessary for students to succeed in advanced mathematics and science courses. Students will learn to solve equations and inequalities with one, two and three variables and express solutions graphically as well as in solution set form. The concepts of solving systems of equations and inequalities, learning and applying exponent rules, performing operations on polynomials and learning to factor will also be covered in this course.

Supply Fee: \$15 per student

Class Fee: \$50/month, \$400/year

Class minimum: 2 students

Algebra II: This course will continue the study of Algebraic concepts begun in Algebra 1. Students can expect a brief review of exponent rules and factoring concepts followed by learning to solve algebraic fractions, rational degree, and quadratic equations and inequalities. The course will also explore the complex number system, graphing conic sections, and working with logarithmic and exponential functions.

Grades: 8th & up

Class Day/Time: Tuesday & Thursday 9:30 AM

Supply Fee: \$15 per student

Class Fee: \$50/month, \$400/year.

Class minimum: 2 students

Geometry: This course is the study of spatial relations. Geometry is a comprehensive exploration of “shapes”, the measurements associated with those shapes, and the relationships that can be established between those shapes. This course will begin with the introduction of these shapes and how to build and measure them. Next we will begin our study of “Plane Geometry” by developing all of the necessary terms, definitions, and assumptions we will be using as a basis for studying geometric relationships. These fundamental terms, definitions and assumptions will then be used to develop formal proofs of fundamental theorems. With these fundamental theorems in place we will then begin a complete, methodic investigation of the geometric relationships associated with triangles, other polygons, and circles.

SCIENCE

Biology: This course will cover the basics of the study of living organisms. Topics will include an brief introduction to cell biology, classification of living organisms, metabolism, ecology, and genetics. Laboratory experiences, including dissections, will be included as part of the course.

Grade: 9th and up

Textbook: Exploring Creation with Biology, Wile and Durnell, Apologia, 2nd Edition

Class Day/Time: Thursday 3:00 PM

Chemistry: This course serves as introduction to inorganic chemistry. Topics will include the atomic model, chemical equations, stoichiometry, chemical reactions, and acids/bases. Laboratory experiences will be included.

Prerequisites: Algebra I at minimum, Algebra II preferred

Grade: 9th and up

Textbook: General Chemistry, John D Mays, Novare, 1st or 2nd Edition acceptable

*Other supplies needed by students: Calculator capable of scientific notation and logarithms; pair of chemical splash safety goggles (for labs); solutions manual for text (optional)

Note: the accompanying lab text will not be used significantly and therefore does not need to be purchased

Physics: This algebra-based course introduces students to an overview of physics. Topics covered include scientific inquiry, motion (including Newton's Laws), energy, momentum, atomic structure, heat and temperature, pressure and buoyancy, wave behavior, electricity, DC circuits, magnetism, and optics. Students will use inquiry-based experiments as well as mathematical models to explore concepts.

ENGLISH

An Introduction to Writing & Literary Analysis with Grammar: This step by step class walks students through the process of writing essays and teaches the basics of analyzing literature. Students should become confident essay writers as they delve into the details of the essay-writing process. From thesis statements to transitions, introductions and conclusions, students will learn the building blocks of a well-crafted essay. Students will also practice the basics of grammar through a unique study of the grammar in Robin Hood.

Advanced Writing for College Readiness with Grammar: This advanced writing class is designed to prepare your students for collegiate writing. Students will gain valuable experience through varied writing assignments such as rhetorical analysis, research papers, argumentative essays and much more. Students will also gain exposure to the MLA and APA writing formats, PowerPoint presentations, and critical thinking exercises in order to be as prepared as possible for their college writing experiences. All teaching will come from the Excellence in Writing Teaching Model.

Class Day/Time: Thursday, 10:30 AM

Literature Alive (Literary Analysis with Writing): Does literature come alive for you? This class will introduce you to a method of "deep reading". This approach helps you to learn about the context of stories, including the historic, literary and artistic content of the works, in addition to the plot, setting, characterization and other elements of the text. The works will come alive as you learn the basics of analyzing literature in a discussion based, engaging setting while becoming familiar with some of the greatest writers of all time. Worldview lessons will be sprinkled in as we discuss the messages being subtly conveyed through familiar stories. The goal is to prepare the high school students to write and discuss literature in a way that will prepare them academically for college, while also preparing their hearts to stand firm in their Christian beliefs. Every piece of literature is written from a specific worldview. It is important that we provide our students with analytical tools needed to recognize and be on guard against ideas that lead them away from the Christian worldview. As we study different historical ages, students will learn the forces, issues, people, and movements that have shaped our modern world. Bob Jones curriculum will be the basis for this class.

ACT Prep: Learn tips and tricks for each section on the ACT! Standardized Tests are a beast of their own. It takes more than just knowledge in the areas covered to score well. This class is designed to have a set time for students to study for the ACT and be held accountable for taking the practice tests. We will cover each of the four sections.

Speech & Debate: This class is designed to help your student overcome their fear of speaking and become confident orators! Life is filled with public speaking opportunities both big and small. Whether it is speaking up at a neighborhood homeowner's association meeting, sharing about God's goodness in Sunday School, or pitching an idea at a work board meeting, the opportunities abound. Being an effective confident communicator is a valuable skill to have. Studies show that children who learn effective public speaking skills rise to the top 5% and are selected for advancement by teachers,

employers and communities. They are better equipped to live with confidence and grace, to reach their goals, and to have eternal impact. Through speech and debate students learn logic, analytical reasoning, critical thinking, teamwork, interpersonal skills, and have a broadened life experience. Homeschool speech and debate is about being effective, godly communicators capable of bringing about change in the world around us.

Research, recipes and projects will make the class interactive and fun. The goal will be to help establish lifelong personal, nutritional and hygienic habits and a desire to eat wholesome foods that support great health. This course will be food-allergy friendly.
