GRADUATION 2022

This year, CHALC held its 27th annual homeschool graduation ceremony on Friday, May 27, at Calvary Church in Lancaster. A total of 43 graduates were honored at the ceremony, which also featured a video collage of the graduates, speeches from both a keynote graduate speaker, and the awarding of diplomas by parents.

The evening started off with a welcome and prayer from Dave Mease, followed by a dynamic singing of the National Anthem by Soren Lefever.

The seniors sang, "Build My Life" by Pat Barret. This worship song is an affirmation that we will build our lives on the firm foundations of love and trust.



The senior's worship band then led the audience in "Rest on Us" and "Promises." Bella Imchen continued to led the team, as she had throughout the year, and I can still hear her refrains, "Come down Spirit, when you move you ..." and "Though the storms may come, and the winds may blow, I'll remain steadfast."

“FORTITUDINE VINCIMUS”

Representative Brett Miller was our keynote speaker. He is a graduate of Penn State, Millersville, and Liberty University. He currently serves in the House of Representatives for Pennsylvania’s 41st District. Rep. Miller has been involved in assisting the community 26 years as a guidance counselor in Lancaster County’s public schools, nine years of service as an East Hempfield Township supervisor, and many more state and local level positions where he has done everything in his power to make a positive impact.

Rep. Miller helped transform East Hempfield township from a tough financial situation into a well-managed surplus. His appointments in Harrisburg include the committees of Local Government, State Government, Aging and Older Adult Services, and Consumer Affairs.

His message to the graduates was family focused, positive, and engaging. He took time to acknowledge the work and passion families poured into their graduating senior.

As an educator, Representative Miller counseled us to do some follow-up work. He reminded us that Pennsylvania is a land of religious freedom and encouraged us to visit the Governor’s Reception Hall in Harrisburg. This is one of his favorite places and it is filled with the rich history and heritage of our state. Representative Miller also asked us to find out more about Ann Askew and John Witcliff. His final request was that we took time to read *Endurance*, by Alfred Lansing.



An impactful moment was when he renamed the class of 2022 as the class of “Fortitudine Vincimus”. The meaning of this is:

“Blessed/Prosperous and Overcome/Conquer”.




Senior Gracie Herr

This year, Grace Herr, had the distinction of being both the student speaker and best of class. Gracie, as she is commonly called, is the daughter of Thomas and Shirley.

There was a lot to consider as the CHALC board looked over candidates for best of class. In the end, Gracie was selected because of her well rounded experiences, including work history, civic engagement, missionary work, volunteer history and certifications. When I looked at her “resume”, I noticed a love for family, neighbors, and complete strangers. Growing up on a dairy farm is full of chores and hard work that can be all encompassing. Few would venture to say anything if such a person’s life consisted of work around the farm, a few precious hours with friends and going to church and visiting relatives on Sunday.

Yet Gracie’s story is much fuller than that. In addition to home responsibilities, working in the trenches at Hodecker’s Celery farm, harvesting potatoes at King’s Potatoes, and working at Kreider’s Market, Gracie could be found hard at work practicing her Bible quizzing and basketball. Her preparation and execution paid off as she was top level quizzer for many years and a gifted basketball player earning an MVP, Sportsmanship award, and 1st and 2nd team All-Conference.

Work and play aside, Gracie’s heart for the Lord and humanity really shines. She has seized the opportunities around her and could be found in other states and countries. Going to a third world country prison to distribute supplies and food seems like quite the experience, but Gracie also took the time to help out at an orphanage. The Son of Man speaks well of this in Matthew 25 when he says, “Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to Me.” This was in just one trip to Haiti and Gracie has helped out in many more places.

Reflections on the Class Speech

The heart of the message for seniors and their guests was that of setting “our perspectives right and to use what is in our hands.”

Gracie began her speech by thanking the “principals” that ran the show in the homeschooling experience. I thought it was so appropriate that “principal” and not “teacher” was used to describe the parents in their roles to educate their seniors. A principal’s role is much more global in nature than a teacher - overseeing the instructional process, the disciplinary system, the budget, extra-curricular, and record keeping.

The next part of the speech focused on the right here and now. Yes, it is good to plan ahead, but the main question is what can I do for God right now?

Like Katie Davis Majors, who adopted 13 young girls from Uganda by the age of twenty, stated, “people who make a difference ... hold the conviction that individuals are extremely important” and “they aren’t determined to revolutionize the world all at once [but rather] are satisfied with small changes [that] add up”. The decision to parent so many at such a young age stems from an eternal perspective that individuals are made in God’s image and that the time to help others is now.

Gracie proceeded to challenge the audience to look to make a difference with what they had in their hands. Commencing with Moses and his rod and ending with David and his stones, she challenged us to have an eternal perspective and use what is in our hands. During the course of the speech, Gracie told the perils of Gladys Aylward.

With Gracie’s EMT training, I am sure she would have joined in with Gladys in a heartbeat. In the midst of a war and needing to travel with stealth through scores of miles through treacherous wilderness and enemy forces, Gladys lead 100 children to safety. In times like these it’s just a moment at a time and the immediate need is ever present. Whether you have something as precious as 20 or 100 children in your hands or a small collection of rocks, Gracie challenged us to use it for the honor and glory of God.

Well done, Gracie, in writing and delivering the senior speech for the graduating class.







2022-2023 Featured Classes

Biblio History Year 1 & Year 3

Full Year - Mrs. Shallon Rohrer

Introducing two years of a classical history and historic literature rotation to give a complete history chronology in four years. Combining U.S., World, Biblical, and Church History, Geography and more, Biblioplan starts at Creation and continues through modern times. In 2022-2023 years 1 and 3 are being offered with the goal of offering years 2 and 4 the following year. Both classes follow the format of homework each week, including reading in the textbook, answering related questions, writing summaries, and map pages to go along with the chapter.

Year 1—Ancients covers World and Biblical History from Creation through the Fall of Rome. Chronologically speaking, it starts with the seven days of Creation, and ends with the demise of the last Western Roman Emperor in AD 476.

Year 3—Early Modern covers U.S., World and Church History from 1600 – 1850. Since England planted its first lasting American colony in 1607, Year Three is the first year that includes U.S. history.

Pre-calculus

Full Year, 10th-12th grades - Mrs. Peggy Teeter

This class will provide students with background to key mathematical concepts needed to prepare for calculus. Topics include trigonometry (definitions, operations, inverse functions & identities), rectangular & polar coordinates, functions, domain & range, logarithms, sequences & series, limits, and imaginary/complex numbers. Graphing of functions will be reviewed. Course will include one-hour weekly class, weekly assignments, quizzes, and unit tests. Prerequisites for this course include Algebra II and Geometry, with a minimum grade of C achieved for each of these classes. Textbook: PreCalculus with Trigonometry, published by Math-U-See, 2010.

MUS Geometry (Sect. A-8am)

Full year, 9th-12th grades - Mrs. Peggy Teeter

Prerequisite: Algebra 1. This course in Geometry covers the basics of lines, planes, angles, triangles and congruence, the Pythagorean Theorem, similarity, and special right triangles. Critical thinking skills will be developed using a variety of logical problems both of geometric and algebraic perspective. This course includes communication with the vocabulary and notation of Geometry, deductive reasoning, measurement, discrete math, problem solving and application of geometric theorems, drawings, and models to real world problems. The use of technology, manipulatives, and discovery learning will be used to build the foundation for application and further pursuit of mathematics. Textbook for this class is Geometry by Math-U-See. Student Workbook and Test Booklet.

Hebrew

Full Year - Mr. Benaiah Fogle

This class is an introduction to the Hebrew Language of the Old Testament. Students will learn to read and write the letters of the Hebrew Alphabet along with its vowel markings, as well as read and pronounce a list of basic vocabulary words. Students will learn the basic grammatical features of the language and will by the end of the class be able to read and translate short sentences or verses. Other topics that will be covered include; The History of the Hebrew Language, The difference between Biblical Hebrew and Modern Hebrew, Biblical Hebrew Study Resources, Practical uses for Biblical Hebrew, How to continue your study and more.

Intro to Architecture

Spring 2023 - Mr. Mark Campbell

An introduction to architecture includes the application of the principles of form and function to the design of buildings intended for a particular use on a certain piece of land. The use of area standards for the layout of a building interior will be practiced, and the elements and history of exterior design and architectural style through history will be explored. Some of the fields that are part of the complete building design process will be reviewed. Students would need to be comfortable with algebra, geometry, and mechanical drawing or sketching. Each student will prepare and present a design project as part of this class, either individually or as part of a team. There will typically be weekly homework and at least one test. The required text is The Story of Architecture by Jonathan Glancey, and other readings may be assigned by the teacher.

Jane Austen's Life & Novels

Full Year, 9th-12th grades - Mrs. Heather Cherasaro

This class focuses on the life of Jane Austen and an in-depth study of three of her novels and the ways in which she expressed her concerns and preoccupations with the changes that occurred in her time. These changes included: the status of women; the interconnection between marriage, money, and love; and the relationship between social status and wealth. Books to be purchased: Persuasion, Emma, and Pride and Prejudice.

Health

Fall 2022 - Mr. Adam Newswanger

This class covers multiple areas of health: maintaining health through exercise, diet, and hygiene; safety; basic first aid; preventing diseases; avoiding drug abuse; and the variety of medical careers that exist. The textbook for this class is Health in Christian Perspective by A Beka Books.







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Learning Station

Our parent-run homeschool co-op meets at Lancaster Evangelical Free Church (LEFC) in Lititz, PA. Elementary classes run for 10 weeks per semester while 7th-12th grade students attend upper level classes for 10-15 weeks per semester.



Learning Station offers two tracks to membership: co-op track and upper level only track. Co-op track members teach and serve within Learning Station. This track is required for all families with enrolled elementary-aged children or those with older students who wish to participate in Learning Station's Theater Arts program. Upper level only track registration is open to families with 7th-12th grade students after co-op track students have registered.

Elementary classes vary from year to year. Learning Station's members' interests and talents dictate the subjects and topics taught. Our elementary classes are designed to supplement your home curriculum--not replace it. Therefore, most of the work will be done in class. Our upper level classes, however, include "for credit" academic courses as well as "enrichment" options.

Instructor highlight....

Leigh Ann Rohrer graduated from West Chester University, earning a BS in Kinesiology, and Penn State University with a Master’s of Education degree in Health. She taught Physical Education in the School District of Lancaster up until having her first child. Leigh Ann also enjoys sewing, hand embroidery as well as quilting. This year will be Leigh Ann Rohrer’s 16th year teaching for Learning Station. She will be sharing her creativity and expertise as she offers Anatomy and Physiology and Sewing classes this year.

Cliff Zeller has a bachelor’s degree in History and a Masters in Bible with a proficiency in Greek from Bob Jones University. Having taught and tutored homeschoolers since 2004, he is a well-known and well-loved fixture in the homeschool community. Prior to teaching homeschoolers, he taught at Lebanon Christian Academy from 2002-04. He spends much time hiking and exploring PA’s forests searching for historical relics and all things sciency. This will be Cliff Zeller’s 12th year teaching for Learning Station, and he will be offering Biology, Chemistry, & Survival.

STEM at Learning Station

Anatomy & Physiology: This course will provide a basis for understanding how changes in structure and function can lead to injury and disease. Practical and hands on labs to help students understand how our bodies work.

Biology: This hands-on, non-evolutionary class will focus on the amazing diversity of living things. Labs are included. Some activities include using microscopes, dissecting specimens, performing various experiments, going on local field trips, and learning to debate evolution based on facts.

Chemistry: This class is designed for students in 10th through 12th grades and others with Algebra 1 skills. Many lab opportunities ensure that students gain a firm understanding of chemistry. Some of the labs include density of solids, precipitate formation, stoichiometry, solubility, and titration of acids and bases.

Food Chemistry: Chemistry? Really? Why do we have to learn chemistry? What does it have to do with “real life?” This class will take ingredients from our everyday lives and explore how they make chemical reactions everyday in our real lives! This will be a fun, hands-on class that lets you play with and (hopefully) make some yummy, maybe even messy reactions to see how chemistry plays an important role in our lives.

Introduction to Architecture: The class will provide students with an introduction to architecture. This field includes the application of the principles of form and function to the design of buildings intended for a particular use on a certain piece of land. There will be practice in the use of area standards for the layout of a building interior. There will also be instruction in elements and history of exterior design such as classical architecture and various architectural styles through history. Some of the fields that are part of the complete building design process will be reviewed. Students would need to be comfortable with algebra, geometry, and mechanical drawing or sketching.

Introduction to Engineering: This course will offer an overview of the field of engineering, emphasizing engineering as the practical application of scientific and mathematical knowledge for the betterment of humanity and the world. The course will provide instruction about historical, technical, and ethical aspects of engineering. Different specialties within the field of engineering will be introduced and described, offering students an opportunity to see different ways in which engineering can be applied in a career.

Introduction to Meteorology: The high school level course will start with a review of the atmosphere and how it works relating to weather. Students will discuss topics such as temperature, humidity, condensation and types of precipitation. The next section will focus on wind and air pressure, and cover topics such as the role of the jet stream and global wind patterns. Subsequent sections of the course will focus on weather fronts, thunderstorms, tornadoes, and hurricanes. Study concludes with a focus on the Earth’s climate, weather forecasting, and a review of weather patterns in Pennsylvania.

Ornithology: Come learn about the birds around you and unusual birds you’ve never heard of. Learn about fascinating bird characteristics and behavior, and discover what we can know about God through the variety of birds he’s created and the specific ones He mentions in the Bible.

Physical Science: This class is activity based and covers a broad review of earth science with some introductory chemistry and general physics. Topics include measurement and units, the structure and classification of matter, the Periodic Table, water & the hydrosphere, the hydrologic cycle, air & the atmosphere, weather, the lithosphere, magnetism, gravitational acceleration, forces & motion, atomic behavior, and the solar system (sun & planets, etc.).

Physics: This class will alternate between lectures and labs. The following topics (among others) will be covered: Measurement and Units, Vectors, Motion (displacement, time, velocity & acceleration), Newton's Laws, Momentum, Work and Energy (potential & kinetic), Circular Motion, Periodic Motion, Waves and Optics, Electricity and Magnetism, Light and Sound.

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


