

You may be wondering what makes MACH different from other co-ops?

Did you know, Pennsylvania passed House Bill 1615, which changes the compulsory school age fror ages 8-17 to ages 6-18? Homeschool parents now need to provide an affidavit, compile a portfolio and have an evaluation done for any child 6 years or older. At MACH we provide academic classes *all ages*. Our classes are on a scheduled rotational basis, so you know your child will receive all the necessary training in science, history, physical education, and in the secondary grades, English Writ & Literature. Our co-op classes provide this necessary teaching, as well as provide worksheets, projects, etc. to include in the homeschool portfolio.

Elementary Students:

- Receive teaching of history from K- 6th grade, with a 4th grade emphasis on PA History.
- Are taught all areas of science, with class time dedicated to lab work, "hands-on-activities", and special in-depth unit studies.
- Participate in year-long gym classes, and are instructed in a variety of group spolearning teamwork, listening skills, coordination, and agility. At-home physical fitness is also encouraged. Log sheets and tests are optional but make great additions to the homeschool portfolio.
- In addition to the morning classes of history, science, and gym, students may choose to participate in afternoon electives such as art, life skills, Lego club, mus and drama.

Junior and Senior High Students:

- Students completing our regular rotation of morning courses, will receive all the credits needed to fulfill the homeschool law in the area of Science, English, and Social Studies.
- Areas of science which are taught: Earth Science, Life Science, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, and Anatomy & Physiology
- Social Studies rotation includes: Early American History, Renaissance & Reformation, World Geography, Modern World History with World Religions, Personal Finance (economics), Government/Civics, and Psychology.
- Our English rotation includes a strong writing component in the junior high year including instruction in writing a research paper. Grade appropriate novels are read and analyzed. Students will also learn speech skills and give oral presentations. High school students rotate through the following three courses English with an American Literature emphasis, English with a British Literature emphasis, and English with a World Literature Emphasis. High schoolers will continue to sharpen their written communication skills, as well as their oral communication skills through both individual and group presentations.
- Students may participate in additional afternoon electives, such as art, debate, volleyball, and music/drama. Math classes are also available at this level.

What does this mean for you as a parent?

 Having a continuous rotation of classes gives parents the assurance their studen receiving all the teaching and instruction needed to fulfill the homeschool law. I helps eliminate the guess-work and stress of wondering if your child is learning a they need to know!

FIELD DAY 5/1

<u>Full Membership:</u> Familes with students of any age are eligible for Full Membership. Both parents and students attend CHEX on Wednesday mornings. Students take classes during all three hours. Parents participate in Prayer and Share time, teach and assist in classes, and volunteer in other roles. Full membership is based on number of students in the family with the fee capped after 4 students.

Drop-off Membership: Students in grades 7-12 are eligible for drop-off membership. Parents are not required to be present at CHEX on Wednesdays. Drop-off membership fee is based on number of classes taken.

<u>Support Group Membership:</u> This option is available for families who want to participate in some extracurricular activities such as field trips, track and field day, and be part of the larger CHEX community.



FORMAT: Parents teach or help in classes for two hours and join "Prayer & Share," a time of fellowship and encouragement with other parents, for a third hour. Elementary (nursery thru 6th) meets 8 weeks each fall and spring; nursery is provided. Second Level academic classes meet for 12 weeks each semester.

COMMUNITY: The members of CHEX are able to develop a close community. During Prayer and Share, parents grow their friendships with each other. As the class teachers, parents are able to develop closer relationships with their children and their peers.

TIME: We meet on Wednesdays with required devotions and announcements starting at 8:45 am. Classes begin at 9 am. We have three class periods for 55 minutes each, ending at noon. All families are welcome to enjoy their lunches together afterwards.

LOCATION: Calvary Baptist Church, 530 Milton Road, Lancaster (off Lampeter Road), centrally located near Rt. 30. We use CBC's facilities, but are not affiliated with the church.
