### Get Caught up with CHALC!



Here are some announcements from our CHALC Leaders' Breakfast on October 14, 2023:

- 1. **Science supplies are available to borrow from Elizabethtown College.** "Science in Motion" Equipment Request as well as a link to the list of supplies will be made available on chalc.org.
- 2. Sarah Northrop from Firm Foundations Academy presented about the Vision and Vocation Institute, an 18-month program beginning in the fall of 2024 for seniors in high school and any student ages 18 to 21. The student has to be 18 by January 1 of the year they enroll. A PDF of the program description is available on chalc.org.

She would like an opportunity to come to your co-op and present this program to your high school students and parents. This program emph sizes vocation: Where is the Lord calling you? Another emphasis on glor fying God in the workplace, being salt and light in our workplace, being culture shapers.

During 3 sessions of coursework spread over 18 months, students will learn about life and vocation, literature and history, Old Testament and New Testament Survey, and building a theology of work.

Student will do one or two apprenticeships. Currently 13 businesses are partnering with VVI. The businesses want applicants with strong character who are innovative, collaborative, teachable, and able to lead. They will teach them the hard skills they need. These are paid apprenticeships that the students will be able to add to their resume, might lead to a full-time job, and will help them launch their career.

3. Gwen Schuit, retired CEO of Friendship Community, with expertise in nursing education, leadership and art education, shared around the topic, "Homeschool Leadershift Essentials to Embrace."

### Here are some takeaways:

- Leadership is simply influence. Leaders, it's a good idea to decide whether to focus on solving problems or developing people.
- We lead in proportion to our level of faith. We control in proportion to our level of fear.
- The best learning is intentionally created. As a leader, choose an Inner Circle people close to you, your confidants. Also, create and foster an Outer Circle of people who are gifted differently, who will challenge you to get out of your comfort zone. You need some contrarians in the room, and you need to listen to them!
- Don't be a soloist, be a conductor.
- When you have one-on-one sessions, don't leave before you know what the other person values.
- As a board or leadership team, consider: how will this decision affect others? What can I give?
- No one ever coasted to success. The more you pay for something, the more value it has when you achieve it. Always be ready, willing, and committed to climb the hill first, and then call out, "Follow me!"
- Recommended reading: Jim Collins, Good to Great
- Exercise Care and Candor. When you as the leader need to offer constructive criticism, make sure you flower it. Can you flower it?
- Make the communication shift from Directing to Connecting: collaborate, listen, side by side, empowering, understanding, ask questions and your agenda, not mine.
- Diversity is a blessing! Do not feel threatened by it, because diverse teams fill the knowledge, perspective, and experience gaps for each other.
- Move from Maintaining to Creating: foster creativity and celebrate innovation.
- Move from Positional Authority to Moral Authority: Leaders who
  influence based on who they are. This is attained by authentic listening,
  consistency and building trust. Transforming what is to what can be...
  Look at how Jesus led his disciples.
- Move from a Career to a Calling: embracing your purpose every day inspires those around you.


This is the true story of **Christmas**. Christmas is the day we celebrate the birth of Jesus.
