MACH Elementary Class Description and Book List for 2017/2018

2 and 3-Year Old's

This class will focus on cooperation with other children, in addition to learning and developing motor skills such as coloring, tracing, cutting, and pasting. In addition, this class will allow structured playtime, as well as story time and snack time. A class fee of \$5- \$10 may be charged at the end of the year to cover the cost of copies, craft supplies, and a possible workbook.

Preschool

A variety of activities are used to develop gross and fine motor skills, including cutting, pasting, coloring, writing, and group songs and games. Colors, shapes, and numbers are introduced and studied, but the primary emphasis is on learning the sounds and how to write each letter of the alphabet. We focus on one letter per week and read various books and do hands-on-activities to enhance learning the letter of the week. There is a class fee of \$5-\$7 per semester to cover materials and copies, and a possible workbook used in class.

K - 3rd Grade Gym Class

Working cooperatively with partners and as part of a team, students will develop motor/movement skills and foster appreciation and interest in physical accomplishment. Skills needed to play team sports such as basketball, volleyball, kickball, etc. will be learned through drills and low key playing of these sports.

Kindergarten History

This class will focus on the important events and people of early American history, from Columbus and the American Indians to the Puritans and Pilgrims. Incorporating geography, American history, government, economics, world history and culture, students will receive a foundation for later social studies. Class time will include stories, projects, and other hands on learning. A class fee may be charged at the end of the year to cover the cost of copies and supplies.

1st Grade History

This class will bring life to our American heritage by explaining the lifestyle of the early English colonists. Colonial farming, shop-keeping, clothing, politics, famous people, early wars, and more are covered in an age-appropriate manner, with geography, Bible, some world history, government, economics, and culture presented to promote the understanding of American history. Class time will include projects, stories, and other hands-on-learning activities.

1st/ 2nd Grade Science

Living things, plants, environments, fossils, how the earth moves, heat, and systems of the body are just some of the topics students will explore in this class. More in-depth unit studies of these topics will be incorporated throughout the year. Class time will consist of science activities and experiments, which give students hands-on-learning opportunities. A class fee may be charged at the end of the year to cover supplies and copies.

2nd Grade History

This text subtitled, "Sweet Land of Liberty", examines the events from the Constitutional Convention through the Civil War and Westward Expansion. Through these study, students will learn to sequence events, summarize data, make predictions, identify sources of information, work with graphs, and formulate opinions. Geography, alignment with Bible truths, relevant world history, government, economics, and culture are all presented to help better understand the background of the United States. In class, the students will participate in various activities including stories, videos, projects, and experiences to enhance their learning.

3rd Grade History

In this class, students will learn about the "Dawn of Opportunity," examining the events from the 1700's to the 1900's. Geography begins the year, then we will learn about the mass of people immigrating to America; how that changes the look of America and what freedom means. We will study missionaries, the fifty states in America, the explosion of inventions and how that also changed the way America looked and operated. We will touch on some world history and end with government and economics. This class will include sequencing events, summarizing data, making predictions, work with graphs, and forming opinions. Students will have weekly homework assignments, write several reports, and do projects and other hands on activities.

4th Grade History

PA History will be explored using the *Pennsylvania Keystones* Curriculum. The students will learn more about Native Americans and early settlers in PA, by making timelines about the lives of important people in Pennsylvania's history, participating in group projects like making a wampum belt, reading related books, and other activities.

One of the goals of the class will be to learn the states and capitals of the United States. In class, we will reinforce this learning by playing map games.

The second half of the year, students will learn about American history from the late 1800's to the present time. Students will learn about assembly lines, the stock market, World War I and II, the depression, the Civil Rights Movement, Communism, and more.

5th Grade History-Ancient Civilizations

The 4th-6th-grade gym class will cover the basic skills and rules of different sports during our sports units. We will play a variety of games, emphasizing teamwork, listening skills, coordination, and agility. Personal physical fitness will be encouraged.

Elementary Recess (All Year)

All students will have the option to be in the gym, go outside on nice days, or sit in an area and hang out. We will rotate several Moms each week to monitor this 30-minute time and provide supervision for the gym, outside playground, and study hall area.

Fall Mix 1 and Spring Mix 1

This class is for children 4 years to 1st grade. This class will be held in the nursery so the children can also have time for free play together. The focus will be a Creative Movement Time that will pair music and movement. Moms of the children participating will take turns helping in the class.

Fall Mix 2

This class is for 2nd grade through 6th grade. Our focus will be holiday celebrations! Each week we will be focusing on certain holidays, learning the meaning and history behind them, and celebrating together! With games, food, activities, and fun ideas this class will enjoy and have a new appreciation and understanding for over a dozen American Holidays. We will also take a couple of weeks to learn about safety. Moms will take turns leading and helping in the class.

Spring Mix 2

This class is for 2nd grade through 6th grade. Our focus will be life skills and topics will include cooking, sewing (maybe a simple craft or a lap blanket to give away), cleaning, money management, organizing and community service. This class is for the boys and girls. Moms will lead and help in the class and can suggest or lead a topic they would like to pass on to the students.

Bell Choir for 2nd thru 12th grade (Offered in the Spring)

Taught by Jim Hoffman. Cost of \$45 for the semester. The Bell choir will perform at Presentation Night and another local nursing home after Presentation Night.

Vocal Ensemble for 2nd thru 12th grade (Offered in the Spring)

Taught by Todd Brill. There will be a cost for the choir that will be divided among the participants. We will need a piano player during the choir. Because Psalm 150 says, "Let everything that has breath, praise the Lord, join with others and learn sound vocal technique. We will touch on proper vocal support, diction, posture, deportment, and solfeggio with hand signs in order to blend our voices into a unified sound. We will sing both unison and melody in a variety of musical styles. We may even write our own song. We will prepare 2 or 3 songs for Presentation Night and to share at a local nursing home. Come make a joyful noise in the MACH Vocal Ensemble.

Fall Art and Gym Class

Art will be taught by Alan Snavely for upper elementary and junior high students. Students are welcome to participate in this art elective, which will alternate between art and gym games. Art will focus on learning the fundamentals of art, some famous artists and paintings, and a variety of art techniques. Cost for this class will be for materials only.

Sign Language (Fall only)

Ashley Grimes will continue teaching the students sign language, and new students can join in, too. An inexpensive text will be used in this class and there will be a cost between \$35 to \$45 per student, with a family maximum of \$90, depending on the number of students participating in the class. This class is for elementary through high school-age.

Spring Art Class

Ashley Grimes will teach an art class that will incorporate the history of art and include a variety of projects. Class will meet each week for 15 weeks. This class will have a material fee and teacher fee between \$35 to \$45 per student depending on the number of participants.

Drama (Spring only)

This class will be open to all ages that would like to learn drama based on Bible memorization. Piercing Word Ministries will get this elective started and share how to use the Bible and acting to present the Gospel. Moms will help during the times Piercing Word can lead the elective and then continue with the training given by Piercing Word. The class will have a fee that will include a donation to Piercing Word for their time teaching our group. This group will work on a drama to share at Presentation Night and at a local nursing home after Presentation Night.
