## Our Program:

For students in grades 7-12, we offer a complete program with flexibility to mix and match subjects to suit your family's needs.

We will meet on Mondays, beginning Fall 2019. Each week we will offer

- Catholic religion class
- Humanities - integrated block of literature, history and other liberal arts
- Math
- Science
- Latin, and possibly other languages

Parents can choose for their child to participate in one seminar, all seminars, or any combination that will be useful.

## Fall 2019 classes:

If a student enrolls in Logic 3, they will participate in all the subjects in that row - American Literature, American History and American Government/Economics. The three subjects are highly integrated, and will be discussed together in a 2.5 hour block in the morning.

Also for Fall 2019 we will offer individual classes in the following subjects:

Religion: Catholic theology (curriculum TBD)

Science: Exploring science through experiments (curriculum TBD)  
Apologia Physical Science  
Saxon Physics

Math: Pre-Algebra  
Algebra 1  
Pre-Calculus

Latin: First year Henle Latin

Other levels (and languages!) will be offered if there is a need and teachers become available.

**Tuition:** Tuition amounts are for the academic year

Individual classes: \$150 each (Religion, Math, Science, Latin)

Humanities block: \$450

Facility Fee: \$50 per student, \$100 per family maximum

Administrative Fee: \$15 per student

Some science classes may have an additional lab fee.

Students pursuing our full program for Junior High and High School can follow the following sequence of humanities blocks. Blocks can easily be done out of order. Minimum age is 12 for Logic levels and 15 for Rhetoric levels; exceptions to the age guidelines will be considered by request.
