## **Scholar Retreat Code of Conduct**

- I will follow my school's standards and remember I am representing my school and homeschoolers at all times. I will also follow all rules of the campground not included in the Code of Conduct.
- I will treat my fellow scholars and mentors with respect and consideration at all times.
- I will attend and participate in all scheduled events, unless discussed with a lead chaperone ahead of time.
- Electronics will not be permitted during the day, except to take pictures. I will not post pictures on social media without permission and no pictures/videos should be taken in the bathrooms, showers or any other place that privacy is expected.
- I will do my share in keeping our areas clean and neat. Clean up after meals, bunk area, etc.
- I will maintain personal hygiene.
- I will choose a bunk upon arrival and will not enter the other cabins or tents without an adult chaperone.
- I will not leave a fire unattended and will not burn plastic, styrofoam or metals.
- I will be where I am supposed to be at all times and will let a chaperone know if I need to leave that area.
- I will report all injuries to a chaperone.
- I will not go near any swimming areas without permission or a chaperone present.
- I will wear modest clothing and swimwear, following the rules of the campground.
- I will adhere to the rule of a 3-buddy system and not spend time one-on-one with other scholars or adults outside of common areas.
- I will think about my actions and how they affect others and myself.
- I will observe lights out and quiet time.
- I agree to have a good attitude and use this experience as an opportunity to learn and grow as a scholar.
- I understand that the lead chaperones may add rules if the need arises due to retreat needs.
- I understand that not following the code of conduct may result in a call to a parent and if
  issues continue may result in being asked to leave the camp and be picked up early by a
  parent or guardian as necessary.
