Nature Study

Class Prerequisites: none

Skill Level Needed: being able to listen to a lecture, reading/writing, public speaking

Minimum to Maximum Enrollment: 3-10

- This is a literature-based class with three 8-week terms per year, each term focusing on a particular area of nature. These topics repeat every 5 years.
- Topics for 2025-26 are reptiles, brook/river/ocean (and landforms), and garden flowers.
- At the end of each term, each student will select something from within the topic of study to research and give a presentation on in front of the class. There are 3 presentations per year.
- Class time will consist of a lecture portion that includes reading from various books on the topic of study, may include short videos, hands-on
 activities that assist students in learning and observing the chosen subject, and some nature journaling. When appropriate and when weather
 permits we may do outside for a portion of class time. A dissection will be done during the reptile term.

- All students are expected to prepare their 3 presentations per year and do their weekly journal assignments.
- Some optional field trips will be planned to reinforce the topics of study and will be up to each family if they prefer to attend or not. (these will not be during CG hours.)

- Students will work in groups to solve problems and design solutions using the STEM design process.
- Each semester, students will be presented with 5 theme-based challenges that will immerse them in hands-on inquiry and open-ended exploration
 while utilizing science, technology, engineering, and math concepts.
- Projects are assigned a point value using a project-specific rubric to determine how well each team met challenge-specific requirements.
- This class will follow a 2-year rotation, allowing students to take it consecutively 2 years in a row without repeating any challenges.
