Attention: All homeschooling families who want a cooperative learning environment to supplement their own schools. For the past twenty years, we have offered enrichment classes in the Mid-Cities area. Benefits include very low cost, a diversity of classes, fellowship and lots of fun!

Classes

1. Classes are parent-taught. With the rich pool of talent found among homeschooling parents, enrichment classes around the country have achieved great success. At least one parent per family must be present during the time their child(ren) are attending classes. The key ingredient is cooperation! Everyone will be busy for all or part of a five-period day. Come for one class or stay all day!
2. A parent must teach a minimum of one class or may elect to serve on the cleaning crew. During the hours a parent is not teaching, he/she will serve as an assistant in other classes. Returning the application form and the talent search form is necessary to be put on our waiting list. Incomplete applications will be returned. The forms are found on our website under Application Information.
3. We meet one day a week for 12 weeks each semester. Arrival time is 8:30am in order to get name tags on and pick up any information from the family mailboxes. We begin each school day with prayer and announcements at 8:40am. Classes begin at 9:00am and end at 2:35pm. We take a 30 minute lunch break.

Cost

The cost of the program is \$50 per family (per semester) plus class material fees as required. The \$50 commitment fee covers the cost of administrative expenses such as facility usage, insurance, equipment maintenance, copies, postage, etc. There is also a one-time damage deposit of \$20 per family. The \$70 for the commitment fee and deposit will be collected prior to registration.

Variety

We offer classes for High School all the way down to Preschool in areas such as History, Science, Math, Music, Physical Education, Literature, Arts, and Foreign Languages. The classes are taught by parents of homeschoolers, many of whom are experts in the areas they are teaching!
